Global Ministry Focus: Belarus

Pastor Rachel reflects on the work of our church partners supporting the humanitarian crisis on the Polish/Belarusian border.



Part of my work as Area Director for Europe is to be in conversation with companions around the region as they respond to the urgent needs of communities with whom they serve. In recent weeks, we've been working closely with the Lutheran Church in Poland and the Lutheran Church in Belarus to facilitate ELCA support for ministry in response to the refugee crisis. You might have read about the situation in the news, but you might not have heard of the ways that our Lutheran siblings in Christ are looking to make a tangible difference in the lives of the refugees. The latest of many examples of how the smaller in size Lutheran Churches in Central and Eastern Europe show themselves to be large in their capacity for living out the Gospel and responding to the needs of the most vulnerable among them. - Pastor Rachel
