**"Community Teaming and Continuum of Care:
The Role of Religious Leaders in the Care Team & Beyond"**

Presenter: Alicia Wolf - MSW, APSW, Certified Advance Care Planning Facilitator

In this workshop, Advance Practice Social Worker Alicia Wolf presents strategies for religious leaders to go beyond supportive listening and spiritual consultation in assisting members of their congregation and their community with everyday hardships they are facing. When these hardships are psychosocial, medical, or financial in nature, there are often resources in the community available to help address and alleviate these concerns, but congregants and religious leaders may not know how to access them. Participants will learn strategies for community teaming and becoming a part of their congregants' "care teams." Participants will learn questions to ask congregants to identify psychosocial needs and existing supports, as well as key community and healthcare organizations to build relationships with in order to improve access to services. Participants who complete this session will be able to leverage their relationships with their congregants to build trust between them and the community organizations that can provide services they need, ultimately increasing congregant participation in programs to help resolve psychosocial needs. Finally, participants will learn ways they can use these strategies and the talents of members of their own congregations to make an impact beyond their individual congregants to the community at large.
