June 2022 Dignity of the Young Child Conference in Dornach - Leslie Wetzonis-Woolverton, I.D.E.A. Coordinator attended the Dignity of the Child conference in Dornach, Switzerland on behalf of WECAN. The following is a note from Leslie; we are so very grateful that she attended the conference on behalf of WECAN.

"This past summer, the International Early Childhood Conference was held, organized by both the Pedagogical and Medical Sections of the Goetheanum. I was delighted to attend this much awaited event, present a workshop for I.D.E.A and to volunteer assistance with colleagues of IASWECE. The full title of this conference, "The Dignity of the Young Child - I feel good in your eyes", presented key lecturers and workshops with leading doctors and EC educators on "How do trust, warmth and autonomy arise in the interaction between adult and child?" The conference and collaboration were inspiring, informative, and addressed what is needed in support for children and families today.

“The Many Faces of Fear — A Global Challenge “ concluded the first night and was led by a collaborative, supportive panel. The leading theme throughout the ongoing days highlighted what we all can do in collaboration to support our work. The participants included Stefanie Allon, Ignacia Gonzalez Rena, Julia Grebner, Stefan Krauch, Angelica Masser, Christoph Meinecke, and Georg Soldner, and the panel was chaired by Stefan Schmidt-Troschke. The clear focus for the remaining conference days centered on pre-birth through the first seven years of childhood. Discussions on how to meet and build connections through families also was presented. On Saturday, Katherine Scharff of Sophia’s Hearth and Dr. Michaela Gloeckler offered the final remarks closing the conference.”
