Rehab of the Schrader Pipe Organ has begun in earnest, as you can see from the pictures below.

Bottom center-left: One of numerous banks of slider motors. You can see a newer one that was recently replaced on an emergency basis. We've learned that many of the motor pulleys that should spin freely are nearly completely stuck. Imagine how many slider motors in a 64-rank organ!
