

The Foundation for Dental Laboratory Technology's Race for the Future 5.0 took place on August 25-26, 2018 once again in conjunction with the Transamerica Chicago Triathlon in Chicago, IL. The 73 degree, humidity free weather may not have been with us this year, but the passion amongst the approximately 45 racers and spectators sweltering in the heat for the future of dental laboratory technology was there and stronger than ever!

Almost the entire Foundation Board of Trustees was in attendance, including Chair Gary Iocco, Vice Chair Sean Siegel, and Trustee Steve Killian, CDT, who each participated on a relay team; Trustees Martha Martin and Jeff Stronk cheered racers alongside the gorgeous Lake Michigan; and Fiscal Officer Shawn Nowak was one of 153 athletes to compete in three events during the weekend, known as the Triple Challenge, which totaled 59 miles – 1.63 miles of swimming, 46.3 miles of biking, and 10.85 miles of running. allowed the Foundation to more than double the grant and scholarship opportunities in the last five years, to invest in an online education platform and enhance its online educational offerings, to help fund the creation of an online comprehensive educational program on the fundamentals of dental laboratory technology, and to build up its reserves to ensure continuity of programming.

The Foundation's mission is to advance the profession of dental laboratory technology by developing educational curriculum and programs that will be relevant and accessible to dental technicians and other members of the dental team, and that's exactly where every dollar raised goes.
