Beginning Thursday, November 19, a 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. statewide curfew will be in effect for 21 days. More information on the curfew can be found at coronavirus.ohio.gov.

Follow these steps if an employee is diagnosed with COVID-19:

- Immediately report employee or customer infections to the local health district.
- Work with the local health department to identify potentially exposed individuals to help facilitate appropriate communication/contact tracing.
- Shutdown shop/floor for deep sanitation if possible.
- Professionally clean and sanitize site/location.
- Reopen in consultation with the local health department.

TALKING POINTS FOR YOU

- Gov. DeWine reminded us that the social gathering order limits public and private gathering to no more than 10 people.
- It's important that we limit our trips outside our home and adhere to the curfew. The curfew is a slow down, not a shut down. It does not apply to employees going to or from work, if there is an emergency or if you need medical care.
- The curfew is not intended to stop anyone from getting groceries or going to a pharmacy. Picking up carry-out or a drive-thru meal and ordering for delivery will be permitted, but serving food and drink in person must cease at 10 p.m.
- By practicing safety protocols, we are protecting our employees, customers, and supporting our community's effort to slow the spread of the virus.
