I am appealing to you for my child Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to both you and me. Philemon 8-11

To the Saints engaged in God's mission within Riverside Presbytery, greetings:

These verses come from a Biblical text that has helped shape and frame my call to the work of Ministry of the Word and Sacrament as a Teaching Elder in the Presbyterian Church. Onesimus is an escaped slave who belongs to Philemon. After making his way from Colossae to where Paul is in prison (scholars suggest Rome or Caesarea or Ephesus), each has connected with the other in a profound way. Paul addresses this letter to his "dear friend and coworker" and sends the letter with Onesimus back to the man who has earthly authority over him. Verse 11 contains the meaning of the word Onesimus: useful/beneficial.

As I depart my service to God within the Presbytery of Riverside, it is my hope that my work here has been Onesimus, that it has been useful to God. In gratitude to God and to you, I share with you these reflections of Thanksgiving, Forgiveness, and Goodbye. Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is Good. God's steadfast love is everlasting...
