Washington Certified Waterworks Operators & BATs,

On October 31, 2025, the Washington State Department of Health (department) adopted final rule revisions to WAC 246-292-995 for Certified operator and public water system certification fees. All certified operators must renew their certificates annually by paying a renewal fee as specified in WAC 246-292-090. This renewal fee will increase on December 1, 2025.

The annual certification renewal period begins in the first week of November (opens by 11/7/25), which makes the fee increase challenging. This means that many operators will pay a lower renewal fee than others this year, depending on when they pay. I strongly recommend that certified operators pay their renewal fee as-soon-as the eligibility window opens. Please visit the www.wacertservices.org to update your email address to ensure you receive the latest updates on certification renewals, professional growth requirements, and training options. Waterworks Renewals and BAT Renewals are now open to pay, and notices will go out this week.

A summary of the few increases are as follows:

- BAT application fee increases from \$51 to \$83, making the total price of a BAT certification exam \$257. Professional Growth exam prices remain unchanged at \$170.
- WDM and WDS application fees increase from \$87 to \$141.
- CCS application fee increases from \$51 to \$83.
- Annual renewal fee increases from \$42 to \$68 (if you hold multiple classifications to include BAT, you still only pay \$68 one time)
- Late fee for renewal payments increase from \$35.00 to \$57.00.
