5. **HB1219 JUDICIARY: Stop Guilt by Accusation Act.** Enacts the "Stop Guilt by Accusation Act," which requires media outlets to provide comparable, equal coverage of a case or controversy after a verdict is reached and the final verdict provided less relief against the accused than originally sought or if they receive a written request from the accused or their authorized agent. Requires media outlets to take down any previously published mugshots if the accused is acquitted, enters into a plea of no contest or receives an outcome more favorable than originally sought by the petitioner. Specifies that any remedy for discrimination under this cause of action does not prohibit victims from seeking other remedies available under the law. 78. **SB602 CONSTRUCTION: Accommodations in public restrooms.** Requires buildings constructed or renovated at an estimated renovation cost of \$10,000 or more on or after January 1, 2022, to include at least one powered, height-adjustable, adult-sized changing table in a single-occupancy restroom that is for all genders.
