### Diabetes Awareness

#### From the CDC Ways to Prevent Type 2 Diabetes

1. Not quite ready to join a lifestyle change program, or waiting for your class to begin? Get started with [On Your Way to Preventing Type 2 Diabetes](#), a practical guide for taking small steps that add up to a healthy lifestyle you can stick with.
2. Not long ago, it was almost unheard of for young children or teens to get type 2 diabetes. Now, about one-third of American youth are overweight, which is directly related to the increase in kids who have type 2 diabetes, some as young as 10 years old.
3. Parents have the power to make healthy changes that give kids the best chance to [prevent type 2 diabetes](#). And when the whole family makes changes together, it's easier to create healthy habits that stick. Get started with these [simple but effective tips](#) for healthy eating and being active family style.
4. **Why is prevention so important?** Because [type 2 diabetes](#) is a serious, chronic health condition that can lead to other serious health issues such as heart disease, stroke, blindness, and kidney failure. ## Environment

### ENVIRONMENT

Several issues ago, I wrote an article on “pollinators” which included insects, birds, bats, and some other types of animals. The emphasis was on how important they are to us and what we can do to help them along. Because of the recent news airings about people being bitten by swarms of bees, I decided to research the pollinators that we are most familiar with, i.e., Honey and Bumble Bees. There is some VERY interesting information about those two types of bees and their life cycles, feeding and mating habits on the internet.

Did you know:

1. Honey Bees are more social than Bumble Bees- they work together and help each other find their food pollen sources. Bumble Bees are more independent and may even “buzz off” to create their own colonies
2. Honey Bees build their nests high above ground (high enough to keep out predators) and Bumble Bees create nests in burrows underground
3. Honey Bees are slimmer with heads distinctive from their bodies while Bumble Bees are round and furry, head is not distinctive because of their plumbness
4. Honey Bees produce more honey (thus their name) and are the bees found at your local beekeeper hives. Bumble bees create honey BUT only enough for their own survival
5. Honey Bees live longer because they hibernate during the winter (Queens can live up to 3 yrs.). Bumble Bees all die in the Fall with Queen “gynes” surviving and emerging in the spring to lay her eggs for the next generation- the bees you will see in early spring are probably Queen bees hard at work to construct her “kingdom”!
6. Honey Bees can only sting once and they will die- Bumble Bees can sting multiple times. Both species are considered docile and only will sting when threaten.
7. Both Honey & Bumble Bees need water for nourishment and to keep cool during hot summer days
8. Bees are not attracted to human scents, as well as lavender oil, citronella oil, olive and vegetable oils, lemon & lime scents- keep that in mind rather than a chemical bug spray
9. Finally, run if attacked by a swarm- bees are slower than humans- you can outrun them...

#### We need pollinator bees and they need us!

#### What can we do??

1. Plant local flowers and vegetables- your local nursery will tell you the best
2. Use organic pesticides-available at Home Depot, Tractor Supply, and other similar stores.
3. Save a spot in your yard to plant clover instead of grass- clover grows well in poor soil, and does not require very little attention

P.S. Back to what we have watched on the news, those bees are what they call “Killer Bees” or as they say- “the bee with an attitude”- they are a mutation of the Honey Bee, first found in Africa, migrated to South & Central America and now into CA, TX, and FL. We are not a conducive environment for the them-yet. African Killer Bees are vicious, easily aggravated, and attack in large swarms. They usually attack the face and feet and will follow you for a great distance- so run fast!

## Hunger

### The New Hampshire Food Bank (cont.)

**Fresh Rescue Program:** The New Hampshire Food Bank, in partnership with supermarkets across the state, collects or enables our partner agencies to recover, fresh meat and poultry that would otherwise be disposed of every week. These high-quality protein products are collected by or distributed to our partner agencies | throughout New Hampshire and are also used in our Culinary Job Training Program to prepare nutritional cuisine for distribution to our agencies.

**Mobile Food Pantry:** Despite the more than 400 agencies and programs we serve across the state, there remain many areas with high levels of need. Even in areas where agencies do provide assistance, clients may not always have access to food because many agencies have limited capacity and can only be open certain hours or days of the week.

Our Mobile Food Pantry program addresses this problem with inner-city food drops on a weekly basis (subject to availability of product). When funding is available, additional Mobile Food Pantry food drops are done in remote locations around the state in response to local need and as a means to distribute nutritious food, such as fresh produce, meats, dairy and canned or boxed items.

**NH Food Bank Nutrition Pantry Program:** NH Food Bank's Nutrition Pantry Program (sometimes referred to as "NPP") combines the best practices of healthy pantry work grounded in trauma-informed principles and processes that promote a client and community-centered distribution. This program, currently in its pilot stage, gives the Food Bank the opportunity to support, educate, and empower our partner agencies as they meet their client's needs. Through this program, we are able to support our agency network and their clients with an integrative approach to nourish all, regardless of socioeconomic status.

**How do we accomplish this?** The NH Food Bank Nutrition Pantry Program works to reinforce the strengths of each pantry by offering technical assistance, resources, idea sharing and connection to the community. Recognizing that all pantries are different, staff and volunteers at the pantry site work with NH Food Bank implementers to identify site- and client-specific needs in the following six focus areas:

- **Cultural & Dietary Accommodations:** *People of different backgrounds have access to food and information that fits their preferences and health needs.*
- **Nutrition Education:** *Clients, volunteers, and staff have access to nutrition and culinary education.*
- **Environment:** *Clients are warmly welcomed, and healthy options are easy to access.*
- **Inventory:** *Food Sourcing & Waste Reduction: Healthy foods are prioritized for distribution. Pantries support a variety of waste reduction efforts.*
- **Community Connections:** *Pantries connect and collaborate with the community.*
- **Policies and Procedures:** *Policies and procedures are documented and align with a commitment to dignified, healthy distribution.*


## LIONS CAMP PRIDE CONNECTION




