Michelle Ackroyd, Childhood Cancer Chair

The American Cancer Society's childhood cancer initiative, Gold Together, empowers individuals to help raise funds to directly support many aspects of childhood cancer. Funds raised through Gold Together go towards research, education, advocacy, and services. It also promotes cancer prevention efforts that could reduce children's risk for cancer later in life.

Research that reaches kids- The American Cancer Society funds scientists who conduct innovative research on childhood cancer. As of March 1, 2021, they were funding 46 active multi-year grants totaling \$27 Million that are specific to Childhood Cancer.

On June 15, 2024 the Salem Lions in conjunction with the team Cathy's Angels will be the Gold Together Sponsor with American Cancer Society at Pinkerton High School, in Derry, NH at the Relay for Life. The money that they raise will go directly to Childhood Cancer research. The Salem Lions would love to have Lions in the surrounding communities join them to give kids more hope through Gold Together. November Cabinet Meeting Recap

In the category of better late than never, here is a recap in a nutshell of the 11/5 Cabinet Meeting. So sorry for the delay ~ Linda Q.

Our November 2023 Cabinet Meeting was held at The Venue in Portsmouth. We had 91 Lions attend. Peter Lund of the hosting Portsmouth Lions Club welcomed everyone and highlighted that Portsmouth is celebrating 400 years in the same year that Lions are celebrating a centennial in New Hampshire. After introductions of cabinet and dignitaries, we enjoyed breakfast together. Then Nashua's King Lion, Erin Hendrickson, introduced speaker Eileen Liponis, the Executive Director of the NH Food Bank. She shared statistics from her side of the feeding business, and made us aware of the continuing need for food distribution throughout the state. Before she departed, we packed her truck with food donations from the Lions food drive.

The Cabinet Meeting reconvened after the Lions Camp Pride Annual Meeting. Some highlights included information from MCC Eric Lindberg about the multi-district MidWinter Convention being planned for Jan 26th-28th. There are several pages of info in this newsletter about MidWinter Convention, including info on the Masked Bash, and the photo contest. First Vice District Governor, Peter Who, shared information on service in our district. He highlighted the success several clubs are having with the Hugs and Cuddle project. He thanked several clubs with certificates of appreciation for embracing the project. Congratulations to Loudon, Salem, Windham, Dover Rollinsford South Berwick, Atkinson, Exeter, and Hudson. Second Vice District Governor, Marie Valliere, made us aware that four 44H Lions were presented with education awards at the USA/Canada Forum in Reno. Congratulations to LeeAnn Middlemiss (Bachelor's degree), ID Steve Middlemiss and SVDG Marie Valliere (Masters degrees), and PDG Al Goldstein (Doctorate degree). Wonderful accomplishments! Lion Gail Dacey shared successes we've had in adding new members throughout the district, and she encouraged all clubs to continue looking for service-minded individuals to join us in providing service. Focus on the service, not the membership, and you will see success. Another way to grow our district is to add a new club(s). PID Ed Lecius recognized PCC Mike Baillargeon for his work in collaborating to add several clubs over the years. Thank you, PCC Mike, for working to make our district stronger.

DG Kamal reviewed our progress in achieving goals so far this year. He thanked everyone for their hard work and shared some great statistics, such as we had served over 56,000 people with 500 service activities (eff 11/4/23). At that time, we had conducted many vision screenings, made \$95,000 in donations, and raised over

\$330,000. Although membership growth is a challenge, DG Kamal is optimistic that we can achieve our goal of net growth with everyone working on it. Service is THE way to get members. Mission 1.5 is designed for us to add more members so we can serve more people.

The meeting continued with encouraging committee reports from Operation KidSight, NH Sight and Hearing, Lions Youth Services, and Lions Twin State Soccer Association. Ed Friedrich, President of Loudon Lions Club, announced the Club's endorsement of Vince Giambalvo for Second Vice District Governor. SVDG Marie Valliere shared disaster relief information from her recent trip to Hawaii. As the meeting wrapped up, we had winners of the 50/50 and raffle baskets. 







Wakefield


