ENVIRONMENT

Last Month we added another "R" (repair) to our Environmental 3R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) rule. Now it is time to add another "R" for REFUSE." This word is usually applied to "single use plastic items". Single use plastic is everywhere and we have become addicted to the convenience of these items! Have you ever wondered why restaurants serve your water with a straw? Or why grocery stores bag your purchases in so many separate plastic bags? The most frequently discarded plastic items are: plastic utensils, straws, grocery bags, plastic plates, and cups- always given freely with your purchases.

All we need to do is to simply **REFUSE** to accept these items. Start small by bringing your own bags to the stores. While at the grocery store, look for the products with the least plastic packaging ex: fresh produce to take home in your own cloth or mesh bag... Think back to earlier years (before plastic), what was used and how can we use those same methods to help reduce our own "carbon footprints?"



Here are 9 reasons why we must address single-use plastic:

1.Made from fossil fuels; **2.** Leaves a huge "footprint"; **3.** Will still be here in 1000 years; **4.** Only a tiny percentage (9%) will be recycled; **5.** Toxins leak into food & drink; **6.** causes hormone problems and cancers; **7.** Pollutes our oceans; **8.** Kills marine life and birds; **9.** Enters our food chains (microplastics).

Did you know that New Hampshire has proposed a House Bill that would ban the use of plastic utensils in NH unless requested by a customer? Condiment packets will also be prohibited unless requested. Sponsors of the bill are convinced this will contribute to the reduction of the plastic pollution- let us do our part and just <u>"SAY NO"</u> to overuse of plastic packaging and free and unneeded plastic items.

Spinach Artichoke Dip (recipe courtesy of DiabeticGourmet.com)

- 1 (14ox) can artichoke hearts (drained and chopped)
- 1 (10 oz) pkg frozen chopped spinach (thawed and drained)
- 8 oz plain yogurt
- 1 C shredded low-moisture Par-skim Mozzarella
- ¼ C green onions (chopped)
- 1 garlic clove(minced)
- 2 TBS red pepper (chopped)

Combine artichoke hearts, spinach, yogurt, cheese, onion, and garlic. Mix well Pour mixture into 1 qt casserole dish or 9 inch pie plate
Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes until heated through
Sprinkle with red peppers







These scholarships are open to all graduating seniors of Pinkerton Academy, regardless of their residency, and to all graduating seniors from any accredited high school, while residing in the Town of Windham.

Four scholarships, each in the amount of \$1000.00, will be awarded upon receipt of the first semester's college transcript with a GPA of 2.5 or higher. The Scholarship Committee has the right to deny issuance of scholarship payment if GPA falls below 2.5.

The Environmental Committee is continuing to spread the NH Lion's Zero-Waste Club Initiative. If your club is interested in participating, we can assist in planning your next event. 
