Manchester Lions Club will be celebrating their 100th anniversary on Saturday, June 24th, and Nashua Lions Club will be celebrating their 100th anniversary on Saturday, September 30th. We hope to see Lions supporting Lions at these grand anniversaries. In 100 years, New Hampshire Lions have grown to over 75 clubs, and over 2300 members. We have done wonderful projects to enhance our communities, and we have raised incredible amounts of money that we donate back to our communities through service projects and support to other organizations.

As we enter another century of New Hampshire Lionism, what can your Club do to serve even more people? Here are some thoughts.

Find more projects – think outside the box, be open to new ideas, brainstorm with all your Club to get a maximum number of ideas.

Invite more people to join you as Lions – many hands make light work, encourage new members to join you in service projects so they get involved, don't assume your friends don't want to join you – ask them and let them make their own decision.

Remember to share your successes with other Lions to – report your service activities, fund-raisers, donations, and meetings in MyLion. Ask for support when you need help. We are a large team working together and supporting one another.

As your First Vice District Governor, I have been learning more about becoming a District Governor. I have attended training and worked with other future District Governors to share ideas and learn from one another. Soon I'll go to Chicago for a week of on-site District Governor education. I continue to stay active in our district, and multi-district with meetings that accomplish great outcomes in New Hampshire, such as training.

Two important trainings sessions coming up include Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI), and Club Officer Training. RLLI is designed to provide growth opportunities for potential leaders within the state, and will take place March 3rd-5th in Tilton. Club Officer training is a way for all Lions to learn more about the roles of President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Membership Chair. Diabetes Awareness – Mary Tremblay

Last year I began a program at the Granite State YMCA to help me change my eating and exercise habits. It is a year long program to help those who are classified as pre-diabetic learn how to live a better life style to reduce the risk of getting diabetes. I have found it has helped me lose weight and be more aware of the foods I eat and the effect they have on weight and sugar and carb contents, all which effect your blood sugar levels.

The information on the programs put out by the CDC is below. If you are interested in a program I would suggest contacting your local YMCA or ask your primary care physician what programs are near you or use the link below in the CDC information.

If you're thinking about making healthy changes to prevent type 2 diabetes. A CDC-recognized diabetes prevention lifestyle change program can help you build healthy new habits that last a lifetime. When you join a lifestyle change program, you'll learn, laugh, share stories, try new things, and build new habits—all while lowering your risk of type 2 diabetes and improving your health.

Key components of the program include: *CDC-approved curriculum with lessons, handouts, and other resources to help you make healthy changes.*

- *A support group of people with similar goals and challenges. Together, you can share ideas, celebrate successes, and work to overcome obstacles. In some programs, the participants stay in touch with each other during the week. It may be easier to make changes when you're working as a group than doing it on your own.*

If you're 65 or older, you can join the [Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program](#)—part of CDC's National Diabetes Prevention Program—and take steps to lower your risk for type 2 diabetes by more than 70%. And if you have Medicare Part B, it's free!

The LCP Board would like to welcome Nashua Lion Erin Freda to the Board. We are sure that she will be an asset to our team.



2023 The Year of the Lion in New Hampshire

Governor Chris Sununu joined with Lions from across the Granite State to sign a proclamation celebrating the birth of Lionism in New Hampshire. In June of 1923, the Manchester Lions became the first club and three months later they chartered the Nashua Lions. In his proclamation Sununu noted that the state has sent six Lions to the International Board of Directors with over 2,000 Lions serving the citizens of the state on a daily basis fulfilling their mission of improving the health and well-being of Granite Staters. Taking part in the State House ceremony were current 44H District Governor Randy Tomkins from Rye, past International Director Ed Farrington from Milford, past International Director Ed Lecius from Nashua, Governor Sununu, Manchester Lions president Gene Martin and 44N District Governor John Wynne from Milford. 
