Virtual Volunteer Opportunities:

- **JA Career Speaker Series:** A volunteer "guest speaker" visits the classroom virtually and shares information about his or her career, work, and education experience.
- **JA Launch:** A point-of-entry program delivered virtually by community entrepreneurs. Students gain firsthand knowledge about starting a business and the entrepreneurial journey.
- **JA Career Panel:** Three to four volunteer guest speakers will visit the classroom virtually and participate in a panel discussion led by a moderator. Panels can vary in career or be concentrated around a particular industry.

Teacher-Led: JA Blended Learning Curriculum: This teacher led approach, provides educators with a dashboard preloaded with program specific curriculum. Educators will have the ability to manage and communicate with their students. Students will also receive direct access to a customized dashboard, including interactive modern day learning modules.

- **JA It's My Future:** Middle school students are offered practical information to help prepare them for the working world. Students will develop the personal-branding and job-hunting skills needed to earn a job.
- **JA Assembling Your Career:** JA Assembling Your Career helps provide middle school and high school students with practical information about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) careers and ways students can prepare for these careers while still in school.
