


Twin Cities Jewish Population Study

The St. Paul and Minneapolis Jewish Federations, in partnership with Brandeis University's Cohen Center for Modern Jewish Studies, are currently conducting a study of members of the Jewish community in the Twin Cities. If you are invited to do so, we strongly encourage you to participate in the study.



Why participate?

The last time a comprehensive study of the Twin Cities Jewish community was published was in 2004, based on data from 2003. Given the scope and significance of changes we all face, and age of the last study, we are long past due for fresh data. The goal of the 2019 study is to gain information and insight into demographics, behaviors, attitudes, and needs of community members that will inform future community programming and planning.

How will I be contacted?

Starting in mid-September, you may be contacted by letter, phone, or email by the Cohen Center and its call center at the University of New Hampshire with an invitation to participate in the survey. Because this is a scientific survey with a defined sample frame, you may not receive one of these calls or emails; however, if you do, we encourage you to respond and participate in this important project on behalf of the entire community.
