For the past three weeks, 500 Jewish Changemakers Fellows, including 11 from our local Minneapolis-St. Paul cohort, have asked themselves these questions. This Fellowship, intended to spark leadership skills and create good professional contacts, inspires young adults to lean into their community and act at a time of unprecedented crisis and

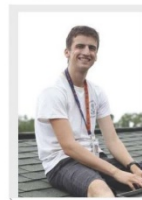
challenge. We work with young adults seeking opportunities to plug into Jewish life, from leadership roles in St. Paul to educational programs in Israel, and we facilitated exploration, reflection, and goal setting during our local cohort meetings with the Fellows.

We realized right away the incredible opportunity this Fellowship was for important and timely conversations—about community, challenges, justice, and the power that we as individuals have to make essential change. Social change leaders, like the members of our cohort, need to be able to tell [three stories](#): the story of self, the story of us, and the story of now. Over three weeks, we dove into these stories, spending time exploring our careers and our sense of personal leadership, learning more about how we connect to the global Jewish community, and thinking deeply about the importance of service and advocacy, especially now that Changemakers across the country are motivated to strive for racial equity in their community.

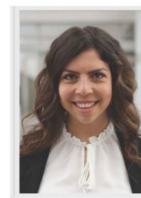

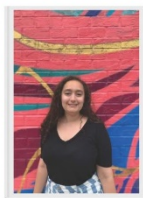
