

Michigan Memories

Michigan Memories is the Michigan-centric counterpart to the **Digital Public Library of America** (DPLA), with access to over one million records.

- A new blog with RSS support;
- An Exhibits section that highlights interesting and memorable photographs and other records while exploring Michigan's history;
- An Education section that explores different themes in our state's history with resources to help teachers use primary sources in their classrooms.
- Archives, libraries, museums, and historical societies around Michigan share their publicly accessible, online collections more widely through the DPLA and Michigan Memories.



The Alpena County Library wanted to give our community a breakdown of what to expect with an executive order eliminating IMLS Funding and what this will likely do to Michigan libraries. On March 14th, there was a Federal Executive Order signed to dismantle the Institute of Museum & Library Services. Many of you may have never heard of that organization before. You may have heard it mentioned in passing as IMLS. While the Alpena County George N. Fletcher Public Library does not receive funds directly from any federal source; IMLS is the federal-level organization that sends funds to the Library of Michigan to purchase, provide, and disperse their funds across Michigan. IMLS's funding is responsible for covering **75%** of the cost of the services listed below.

Services Include:

- Michigan eLibrary databases
- MelCat
- Interlibrary loan service
- Wifi connections and more



On March 14th, the Senate passed and the president signed a continuing resolution for fiscal year 2025, which provides the approval for IMLS to fund these services through September 2025. Although this continuing resolution provides funding for IMLS, on the same day President Trump ordered the elimination of this agency. The newest Executive Order usurps the intent of Congress's decision to provide funding for IMLS, which President Trump had agreed to earlier.

It is hard to know where we will be in 6 months as things seem to change minute by minute, but being informed is the best defense. We also know the Michigan Library Association is mobilizing support to try and mitigate this and keep our wonderful statewide services that so many students, patrons, and Michigan residents rely on.

If you would like to support your local library and advocate for your access to these resources we encourage the community to call, write, and email our federally elected officials and advocate that this is a service widely and continually used and that we do not agree with the dismantling of this organization.







J Non-Fiction:




