**SATURDAY, February 1<sup>ST</sup> – 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM “GOSPEL JUBILEE”** - Canaveral National Seashore and the Harry T. & Harriette V. Moore Cultural Complex in Mims, Florida invite you to celebrate Black History Month with a Gospel Jubilee. Admission is free. This historic location is the homestead of Harry T. and Harriette V. Moore, educators and civil rights activists of the 1930s and 1940s. The Gospel Jubilee will host local choirs and vocalists. Friends of Canaveral will be providing refreshments and additional vendors will be onsite. **THURSDAY thru SUNDAY – 12:00 PM – 4:00 PM “SEMINOLE REST HISTORIC SITE”** – Visit Seminole Rest Historic Site and gain access into the main house. Walk along the half-mile path, and learn about the history of the area. Wildlife viewing opportunities along the lagoon for dolphin and migratory birds are available. The main house is scheduled to be open for 4 hours. (Location: 207 River Rd., Oak Hill FL 32759)

**TUESDAY, February 4<sup>TH</sup> & 25<sup>TH</sup> – 10:00 AM “BIOLAB NATURE WALK”** – Explore the seashore through the viewfinder. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants and animals within the seashore. Bring your camera, water, sunscreen and repellent. Meet at vista 3. (1-2 hours)

**FRIDAY, February 7<sup>TH</sup>, 14<sup>TH</sup> & 21<sup>ST</sup> – 10:00 AM “CAST NETTING AT SEMINOLE REST”** – Try your hand at cast netting. Enjoy the lagoon and see what you can catch. We have a few cast nets, bring your own if you wish. Meet at the Seminole Rest parking area. (Location: 210 River Road Oak Hill, FL 32759) (1 hour)

**THURSDAY, February 27<sup>TH</sup> – 10:00 AM- “SHORELINE SEASHELL HUNT”** – Search for that seashell or sea bean along this pristine undeveloped shoreline. Explore the beach wrack line for treasure. Bring water and sunscreen. Meet at the Eddy Creek parking area. (1-2 hour)

**TUESDAY, February 11<sup>TH</sup> – 10:00 AM- “BARTRAM NATURE WALK”** – Walk the historic Bartram Trail hiked by one of the nation’s earliest botanists. Discover the diversity and beauty of the various plants and animals within the seashore. Bring your camera, water, and sunscreen. Meet at the Eddy Creek parking area. (1-2 hour)

**THURSDAY, February 18<sup>TH</sup> - 10:00AM - “BEACH CLEAN-UP”** - Your participation is vital to maintaining a pristine beach habitat. Join us to help keep Apollo Beach beautiful. Bring water, sunscreen, bug repellent, work gloves, and a hat. We provide trash bags. Meet at parking area 1. (1-2 hours)

**SATURDAY, February 22<sup>nd</sup> – 6:00 PM to 11:00 PM- “NIGHT SKY EXPLORATION”** - Explore the celestial sky with area astronomers. Telescopes will be available for viewing stars, planets and more. Bring bug repellent, water/snacks, and maybe a lawn chair for your comfort. Dress for the weather.
