We are asking DAR Chapters, groups, and individuals who are sewers to lend a hand in service to America. This is not a sewing class, so it is important that those who sign up to work are self-sufficient in operating a sewing machine. Having experienced sewers is crucial to ensure the most efficient use of time.

In order to ensure all social distancing guidelines are adhered to, there can be no more than nine volunteers for any one shift, and all volunteers must wear a mask.

We will be sewing in two shifts - 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 to 3:00 p.m. - on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and
