Delivery Methods

Courses in the Medical Assisting Certificate are available online or in hybrid format. Clinical Procedures requires face-to-face performance of skills and competencies during clinical lab intensives with instructor observation twice a semester. The program also requires a 180-hour practicum at an approved healthcare facility.
