Reading The Voter's Pamphlet

This pamphlet includes important information regarding the Kodiak Island Borough Regular Municipal Election.

Herein you will find voter qualifications, precinct maps, and candidate statements of those running for office.

The Borough Clerk's Office does not write or edit these statements. They are printed exactly as submitted and the information presented are the opinions of the authors. The Borough Clerk's Office does not fact check or correct punctuation, grammar, syntax errors, or inaccurate information.



Voter Qualifications

Kodiak Island Borough Code 7.20.010 Qualifications of Voters.

A person is qualified to vote in borough-wide elections who:

- * is a citizen of the United States;
 - * has passed their eighteenth (18th) birthday;
 - * has been a resident of the state and of the borough for at least thirty (30) days preceding the election;
 - * has registered at least thirty (30) days before the election with the state and is not registered to vote in another jurisdiction; &
 - * is not disqualified under Article V of the State Constitution.
-
- A person is qualified to vote in a service area election if they meet the above requirements and have been a resident of the service area in which they seek to vote for at least thirty (30) days immediately preceding the election.
 - If a voter's polling place is in question, a voter shall be allowed to vote and any election official shall consider the ballot as a questioned ballot.

Voting Absentee Ballot FAQ's

I have a disability and can not go to a polling site. How do I vote?

* **Personal Representative Voting**

Any qualified voter who unable to go to a polling place to vote because of a disability, may, through a representative, request a Personal Representative Ballot from the Borough Clerk or an Absentee Voting Official fifteen (15) days before the election, up to, and including the day before the date of the Election, or from an Election Precinct Voting Official on election day.

I will be out of town during the election. How do I vote?

* **Early Voting**

You may vote in person before Election Day from Tuesday, September 14, 2021 thru Monday October 4, 2021 in the Borough Assembly Chambers from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

* **Absentee By Mail Voting**

Any person may submit a Borough Absentee Ballot By Mail Request Form and a Ballot will be mailed to you.

The Absentee Ballot By Mail Request Form (see next page) must be received by mail or by electronic transmission by the Clerk not less than seven (7) days before the election.

- The application shall include the address to which the Absentee Ballot shall be mailed and the applicant's full local residence address and signature.
- Complete all information requested. It is required by law. Omissions will result in your application being rejected.
- You must provide your residence address in Kodiak. Use the description of physical location: street number, milepost, trailer court and space number, etc.

(If you give a residence address in another state or county, or use a P.O. box, PSC, or rural route number instead of a physical address, your application will be rejected.)

* **Active Duty Military Personnel:**

To remain registered in Alaska you must be an Alaska resident and provide your physical residence address within the State. If you have been assigned to an active duty station outside Alaska, you may wish to maintain your Alaska residence address as it appears on your current registration record. If you provide a new residence address, it must be within Alaska.

- SIGN your application. A friend, spouse, or parent may *not* sign for you.

If you should make a mistake, do not make any other marks on your ballot – this may cause your vote not to count.

Ask an election worker for assistance in receiving a replacement ballot. By law, you may not receive more than *two additional ballots*

Overvote- If you vote for more candidates in a race than what is indicated in the title of the race, (*Race Vote For (2) Candidates*) your vote in that race *will not count*. This is called an *overvote*.

Undervote- You may choose not to vote on a “Vote for Only One Candidate” race or not to make multiple choices on a “Vote for Two (or three, or four)” race. This is called an *undervote*. The machine *will count all properly marked races*.

Qualified Write-In- To vote for a qualified *write-in* candidate (a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot), fill in the oval to the left of the blank line provided “Write-In Candidate Name” and write the name of the qualified candidate on the line. (See an election official for the official list of write in candidates)

Once A Ballot Is Secured In The Ballot Box, It Can Not Be Retrieved

- Review your choices carefully before inserting your ballot in the machine.
- A message will be displayed on the screen if you have *overvoted* any of the races or inserted a *blank ballot*.
- However, a message will not be displayed if you have *under voted* any race. The machine will count all properly marked races.
- Faint marks may not count so please make sure you completely fill in the oval.
