#### **Second Sunday after Epiphany and also “Life Sunday”**

This is *also* our annual "Life Sunday". God gives life, a precious gift. We want to cherish and protect it at all stages, and especially for the weak and helpless among us. The church continues to speak God's unchanging word of life, and works to love our neighbor, individually and corporately. We also rejoice in the forgiveness of Christ, whose blood covers all sins for those who trust in Him, even the sin of abortion.

Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.

*Matthew 10:29-31*

Jesus speaks these comforting words to us to remind us that we have nothing to fear, not even death itself. God, in His divine omniscience, knows all the details of our lives. And, because He loves us, He uses that omniscience to guard us and keep us safely in His kingdom. After all, if God guards and keeps even the sparrows, how much more will He keep you, who are of more value than the sparrows?!

But this comforting word from Jesus also raises the question, why are you of more value than the sparrows? The answer to that question is the foundation for our understanding of the sanctity of all human life. We are all of more value than the sparrows because we have each been “fearfully and wonderfully made” (Psalm 139:14) in the image of God.

Unlike the rest of creation—like the sparrows—which God spoke into existence and upholds with His mighty Word, mankind was wonderfully “made and fashioned” by the hands of God (Psalm 119:73) from the “dust of the ground” (Genesis 2:7).

Even now, God continues to show great care in making each human being, “knitting” every one of us together in our mother’s womb (Psalm 139:13). Therefore, from the moment of conception when God knits us together until the moment of our death, at every stage and in every condition in between, each person is precious to God. We are each so precious that God was willing to send His only-begotten Son to bear the “sin of the world” (John 1:29) and invite us all into His eternal kingdom.
