Religious Reflection



Author of the Month - **Donal J. Sobol**


Fun Facts about Donald J. Sobol • He wrote many other books including the *Two-Minute Mysteries* series. • Sobol wrote more than 65 books. In addition to the books he wrote for children, Sobol also wrote a number of nonfiction books on topics ranging from US Civil War history investing and he also wrote for numerous magazines. • He had four kids of his own. • Some of Sobol's first books were historical fiction books for kids.

- Encyclopedia Brown had its own series on HBO in 1989. • One time, a few 2nd graders from Philadelphia found a mistake in one of his books and Donald later corrected it in newer editions. • He was a World War II veteran • He died on July 11, 2012, Miami, Florida at the age of 87 with a net worth of 4 million dollars.

Cocoa Kiss Cookies:

2 sticks of butter 1 bag of Hershey kisses
½ c. sugar powdered sugar
1 tsp. vanilla 1 ½ c. flour
1/4 c. Hershey cocoa



Directions: In a large bowl beat butter, sugar, and vanilla until creamy. Add butter, beat in until well blended. Refrigerate for 1 hour. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees, unwrap the Hershey kisses. Shape the dough over the kisses in a ball. Bake for 10-12 minute. Cool and roll in powdered sugar.


Hint-of-Berry Bonbons

1 package (8 ounces) of cream cheese, Softened,
1 cup of milk chocolate chips, melted and cooled
3/4 cup of crushed wafers (about 40 wafers)
1/4 cup of strawberry preserves
15 ounces of milk chocolate candy coating, chopped
2 squares (1 ounce each) of white baking chocolate



Directions: In a large mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese until fluffy. Beat in melted chocolate chips. Stir in wafer crumbs and preserves. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours or until easy to handle. Divide mixture in half. Return one portion to the refrigerator. Shape remaining mixture into 1-in. Balls. Refrigerate. Repeat with remaining mixture. In a microwave safe bowl, melt the candy coating. Dip balls in coating; place on waxed paper-lined baking sheets. Refrigerate until set. In a microwave-safe bowl, melt white chocolate; stir until smooth. Transfer to a heavy duty resealable plastic bag; Cut a small hole in a corner of a bag. Drizzle white chocolate over candies. Store in the Refrigerator. **Yield:** about 4-½ dozen.

A SNOWMAN ORNAMENT TO DECORATE YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE!!!


Supplies:

5. LET IT DRY
6. TIE BOTH ENDS TOGETHER
