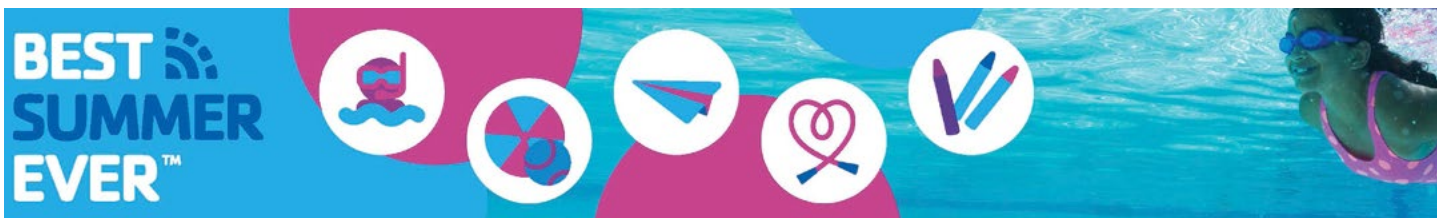

CAMP CARR DAY CAMP

Annandale, NJ

Camp Carr is located in beautiful Clinton Township along the south branch of the Raritan River and adjacent the South Branch Nature Preserve. Camp Carr is your traditional camp environment where children enjoy the outdoors - learning about nature, taking on new challenges, building upon their self-esteem and making new friends. Most of our counselors were campers themselves and have now returned to pass on their positive camp experiences to the next generation.

Each day campers follow a fun packed structured schedule. Each session has a theme week and special days. An example schedule (all groups vary):

Electives are a choice period for campers. TRAVEL CAMP

Ages 8 to 14 years old • June 18-Aug. 10 one-week sessions
Travel camp is for the adventurous camper. Each day the group will hop onboard a bus that departs Camp Carr and travel to an exciting destination. Most trips are within an hour radius of the camp (some may be a bit further). Trip destinations can include, but are not limited to, roller and ice-skating, historical destinations, indoor and outdoor amusement parks, pizza and movie day, swim destinations, and much more. The Travel Camp schedule will be available the first week of February.

Special Notes Regarding Travel Camp:

- 1) The Travel camp schedule is posted early in the year. We do our best to keep the schedule as published, however due to the early creation of the schedule or weather issues we sometimes need to alter the trip destinations. Please be aware the schedule may change; it will be updated on the YMCA website if changes occur.
- 2) Each Wednesday trips are planned to a further destination and will require an early drop off (7:45am) and a late pick-up (6:00pm) at Camp Carr. If your child is a bus rider to and from camp you will need to make other arrangement as they will not be able to utilize the bus on that day.

HORSEBACK RIDING CAMP

Ages 8-13 years old • July 23-Aug. 17 one-week sessions
Campers will be transported from Camp Carr to Kierson Farms and return to Camp Carr. Campers' mornings will be spent at the horse farm experiencing all the challenges of owning, caring for, and riding horses. Experienced staff will instruct children in English and Western style riding along with the daily upkeep of the barn, tack, and grooming of the horses. Each day, campers will ride horses appropriate for their knowledge and skill level. Speakers may include a ferrier and a veterinarian. Afternoons will be spent taking part in traditional camp activities such as arts & crafts, hiking, sports and games or swimming at Camp Carr. 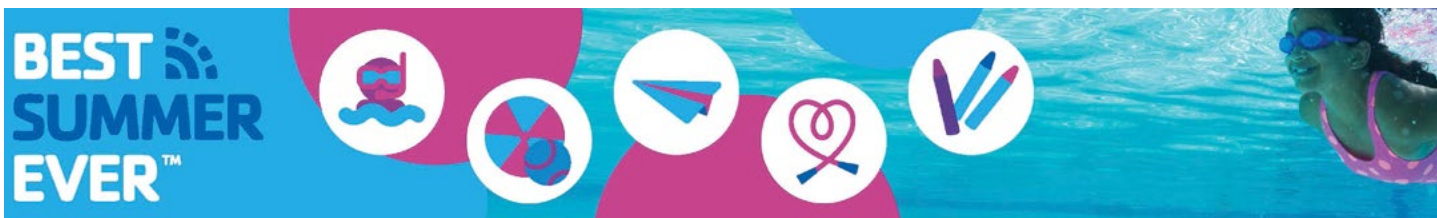

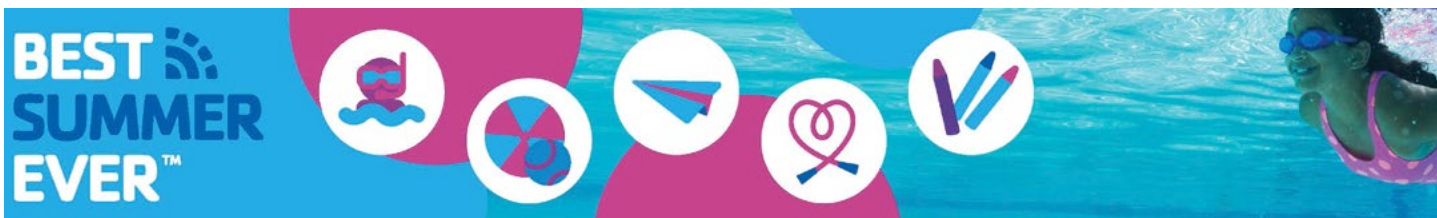

Fishing camp and Farming and Gardening camp weeks are ½ day (½ the day is spent at the ESC and the other ½ of the day campers will return to their home camp for swimming and other camp activities). The Environmental Survival and Adventure camp is a full day camp at ESC. (the entire day will be spent at the ESC campus and campers will be returned to their home camp for dismissal, busing and extended care).

In partnership with our HCY camp staff educators from the ESC will guide campers through a hands on farming and gardening experience. 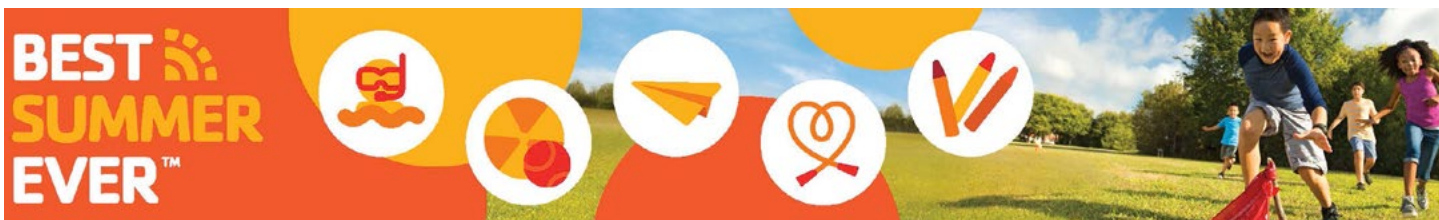

BASEBALL CAMP

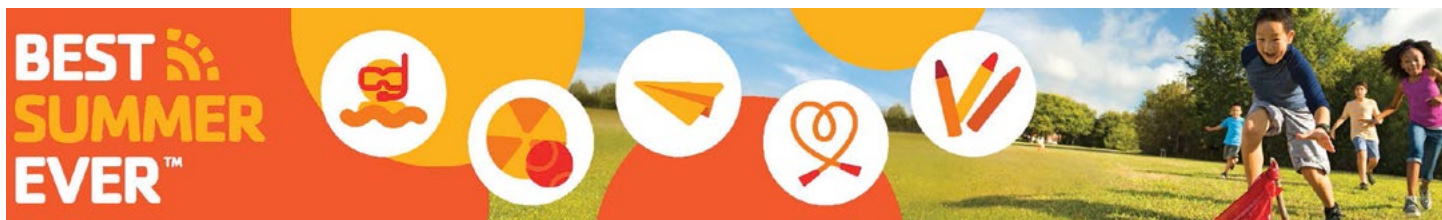
Ages 5-9 years old • July 16 - July 20 (Session 5)

 - b. If your child does have a current membership you may come in person (recommended) or mail your forms in with deposits (or payment in full if registering less than one month before a session). Mailed registrations will be processed on the day they are received.
- A deposit of \$100 per session per camper is needed to register (deposits are non refundable). The \$100 deposits are not an additional fee. It is already included in the cost of camp fees. If you register for Sessions 1-6 after May 1, you must pay in full for those and if you register for any sessions starting June 1 you must pay in full.
- Complete forms included in this camp program guide (Registration pages, Bus Pages, and Health Forms). Immunization records are due by June 1.
- Registration for each session ends the Wednesday before that session begins.
