EIGHT AMENDMENTS TO US CONSTITUTION – VOTING RIGHTS

- 1. **12th Amendment**: Modifies and clarifies the procedure for electing vice-presidents and presidents.
- 2. **15th Amendment**: Reserves citizens the suffrage rights regardless of their race, color, or previous slave status.
- 3. **17th Amendment**: Establishes popular voting as the process under which senators are elected.
- 4. **19th Amendment**: Reserves women's suffrage rights.
- 5. **23rd Amendment**: Reserves the right of citizens residing in the District of Columbia to vote for their own Electors for presidential elections.
- 6. **24th Amendment**: citizens cannot be denied the suffrage rights for not paying a poll tax or any other taxes.
- 7. **25th Amendment**: establishes the procedures for a successor of a President.
- 8. **26th Amendment**: Reserves the right for citizens 18 and older to vote.
