Nursery Care Sundays

Our Nursery is a safe and inviting place for our youngest friends and members to play on Sunday mornings, and during all major church events. The Nursery is staffed by our Red cross certified teen caregivers.

Children's Chapel Sundays

Families begin the worship service together in the Sanctuary. After the Time for All Ages, children are then sung out to participate in Children's Chapel. Joining other children on Sunday mornings can help your child to create friendships and explore the same worship and religious education themes in which the adults are finding inspiration. A mix of stories, games, celebrations, shared snack, activities and group discussion allows all children to chime in with their big questions and helps them to find their own answers.
