VETERANS VILLAGE: VISION REALIZED

In January 2025, Liberation Veteran Services broke ground on Veterans Village on Midlothian Turnpike. By Veterans Day later that year, the project was complete, providing a new home for the organization and the Veterans it serves.

In this facility we will continue the great work we are doing on Hull Street, except instead of barracks-style living, we will now be offering our Veterans their own bedroom, equipped with their own private bathroom. This adjustment is a gamechanger, and will drastically improve morale, safety, and quality of life for our Veterans. In this new environment, we will still encourage a healthy community with a kitchen, dining hall, and other shared spaces designed to foster both independence and camaraderie, while offering our Veterans some much-needed privacy.

Our LVS offices and Veterans completed the move to the new facility in March 2026.

This elevated level of care was no small feat, but our Veterans deserve it. They are going from five shared showers to 50 private individual showers, and so much more. KEYS TO SUCCESS

MR. MAHONE

After experiencing significant life challenges, Mr. Mahone, a U.S. Army Veteran who served from 1980 to 1986, found himself facing homelessness. Fortunately, he was referred to LVS where his journey toward rebuilding his life began. Working closely with his LVS case manager, Mr. Mahone obtained critical identification and documentation, secured employment with Admiral Security, and created and followed a savings plan in preparation for permanent housing.

Throughout his employment Mr. Mahone has consistently shown integrity and discipline by reporting to work prepared and exhibiting reliability, follow-through, and dedication to doing his job well.

As a result of his hard work and perseverance, Mr. Mahone secured permanent housing in June 2025 and celebrated one full year of employment with Admiral Security in August. Mr. Mahone recently shared that he received a promotion this past January.

Congratulations, Mr. Mahone! We are all so proud of you and all you have accomplished on your road to success!

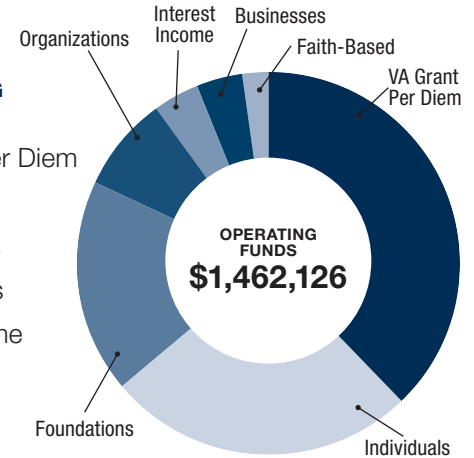
VETERANS VILLAGE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN – PHASE I

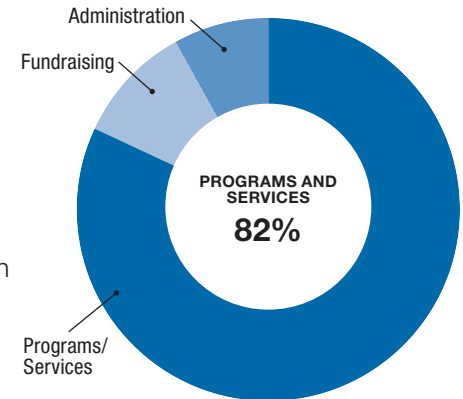
GENERAL OPERATING FUNDS CAME FROM:
