We are embarking now on a stable, shared, and faithful path, with a full-time vicar, dedicated Bishop's Committee, inspirational and hard-working Thrift Shop Steering Committee, strong lay leadership, and a vibrant community that embraces those also on the mainland.

We are poised to share the Gospel message of God's love within creative and expansive ministries. In this time of profound turmoil and transformation in our world, we invite you to walk faithfully alongside us. Within our discernment, in 2024, we feel called to:


- build upon our community connections to support and network with local and regional social services so that we can better serve the most vulnerable

I am personally amazed by the many small moments of profound connection that happen there all the time. We also continue to be the largest recycling center on the North shore and prevent tons of items from entering the landfill. Our parish hall provides a beautiful, spacious, and contemplative space for diverse gatherings including AA, hula, ukulele, yoga, martial arts, and the Community Christmas Choir.

As we open our lives and hearts faithfully to Kilauea, Kaua'i, Hawai'i, and across the world, and as we discover our kinship with one another and all the Earth, it is a blessing to invite your time, talent, and financial contribution as your heart inspires you.
