I still use that phrase sometimes when I'm facing a challenge, and it seems appropriate for this time of year in our seasonal economy. With spring well under way and summer just around the corner, pressure is building in our lives as we consider how to juggle the demands of work, our children's needs, and the daily tasks that become more difficult with traffic and crowds. Job demands increase whether we are self-employed or we work for an employer. Children's schedules become more complicated as the school year winds down, with special activities to make time for and a limited number of children's summer programs available.

As we welcome the sights and sounds of this time of year – a multitude of birds and flowers, so many activities and businesses that were hibernating in recent months – we celebrate the end of another winter. It would be nice to look forward to a relaxing summer, contemplate putting aside routines and finding spontaneous opportunities to enjoy time together as a family. But that is hard to do when we live in a place where we need to work hard at this time of year so we can earn enough to see us through the lean months of winter. It can

feel stressful to see hordes of vacationers enjoying our beaches, our bike trails and nature walks, when we are piecing together care for our children and wondering when we will fit in the grocery shopping.

Sometimes we blame ourselves for the things we couldn't give our children. Maybe we had to miss a Little League game, cancel a commitment to chaperone a children's excursion or cut short a birthday party. Perhaps we weren't able to afford a longed-for summer camp program, or we couldn't fit in a trip our family hoped to take together.

The truth is, we can still enjoy this special season despite the hectic demands of work schedules and other obligations. A spontaneous walk or game with a child can feel special. A shared meal, any occasion that makes a child feel important in your life because you take time to be together, is worthwhile -- especially when smartphones and technology are put aside and you have each other's undivided attention.

We don't have to be perfect parents, live perfect lives, plan perfect summers. It's enough to do our best, and focus on what's important without sweating the small stuff. Our best is good enough.





# One Tough Job

With so much information online

it's often hard to know whether

the advice and resources you're reading are accurate, up to date, safe and reliable.
