HOST-BASED PROGRAMS/LEADERSHIP

Beginning in August 2025, we will have micro host sites for Deaf Ed programs at York Middle School and Brewer Community School. Due to small enrollment, both of those schools will be staffed with itinerant Teachers of the Deaf and Educational Technicians. We will also have students in our new Deaf Ed programs at Lewiston's Farwell Elementary, Lewiston Middle School, and Lewiston HS. We will continue Deaf Ed programming in Portland Public Schools at Lyman Moore Middle School and Portland High School.

The MECDHH/GBSD school programs leadership structure is staffed by Statewide Education and Family Services Director (SEFS) Kim Matthews-Hermans and Assistant SEFS Director Cathy Lushman. Each region of the state will be led by a coordinator, as follows: Northern - Donna Casavant, Western - Erin Bunce, Southern - Melanie Bowlus, Eastern - Megan Garrity, Central - to be determined. The Early Intervention and Family Services (EIFS) program will continue to be led by Amy Spencer.

We are excited to move toward expanded host partnerships and a clearly-defined leadership structure designed to be more responsive to the needs of students, including those who attend school in their home district.
