<u>PINCHAS</u> Pinchas, the High Priest, gets angry over the relations of Israelite men with Midianite women. He kills Zimri, an Israelite man & Cozbi, a Moabite woman for having relations in front of the Tent of the Meeting. God rewards Pinchas for his commitment to public morals & says that Pinchas will merit an everlasting covenant. God makes a "pact of friendship" (brit shalom) with Pinchas so that his descendants will inherit the priesthood. The Israelites then retaliate against the Midianites for allowing their woman to seduce the Israelite men. To further punish the Israelites for having relations with Midianites, God sends a plague upon them. Moses & Eleazar conduct another census; they count 601,730 men 20-60 years old. Moses learns the land is to be divided by lottery among the tribes & families of Israel. The five daughters of Zelophehad petition Moses that they be allowed to inherit their father's land & retain the family name. God accépts their claim: If a man dies without leaving a son, you shall transfer his property to his daughter. This ruling was incorporated into the Torah's Laws of Inheritance. God reminds Moses that he will only be able to view the land from
