It was developed from his experience as a diversion counselor and the need he saw for in-home intervention solutions. Ed is honored to have choreographed thousands of interventions throughout the world.

The Storti Model of Intervention personifies the motivational, inspirational and spiritual method of working with the addictive person. It encompasses the family and provides a moment in one's life where the solution (treatment) is offered as a gift. The Storti Model of Intervention brings together a group of people who honor the patient on the day of the intervention, presenting treatment as a gift, new life and rebirth.

Medical centers, chemical dependency facilities, universities and national conferences frequently request Ed for his educational lectures and presentations. He devotes much of his time to education on the disease of addiction and the process of intervening

Ed serves on the Board of Directors for the House of Hope Foundation, San Pedro, California and as a Member of the Advisory Council of the Bishop Gooden Center, Pasadena, California. Ed and his wife are active in their community.

Ed is the recipient of numerous awards, including the 2009 Spirit Award from the Gooden Center, Pasadena, California; the 2011 Pillar of the Community Recognition Award from Sierra Tucson Treatment Center, Tucson, Arizona; the 2013 Joseph L.
