

Welcome, we are glad you are here! After the service, please join us for refreshments and fellowship in the courtyard on 5th Ave. (weather permitting) or in the Great Hall. And please sign in at the newcomers' table, where you'll get a mug! In the meantime, if you have questions, please find a greeter or usher.

- Infants and Toddlers: Nursery care is available Sundays from 8:30 a.m. noon for children ages o to 3 years. However, babies and toddlers are ALWAYS welcome in our services, regardless of their joyful noise! The first two rows to the left of the center aisle are RESERVED for children, youth, and families.
- ◆ Children's Sunday School: We offer a Godly Play class for children ages 4 to 10 in the 3rd Floor Atrium Room. Drop children off by 10:15 a.m., and they will join you in the service at 11:15 a.m. Ask an usher or greeter for help finding the classroom.
