Welcome, we are glad you are here! If you have any questions, please find a greeter or usher, and he or she will point you to someone who can help.

- ♦ **Infants and Toddlers:** Nursery care is available Sundays from 8:30 a.m. - noon for children ages 0 to 3 years. However, *babies and toddlers are ALWAYS welcome in our services*, regardless of their joyful noise! The first two rows to the left of the center aisle are RESERVED for children, youth, and families.
- ♦ **Children's Sunday School:** We offer a Godly Play class for children ages 4 to 10 in the 3rd Floor Atrium Room. Drop children off by 10:15 a.m., and they will join you in the service at 11:15 a.m. Ask an usher or greeter for help finding the classroom.
- ♦ **Cathedral Youth:** Youth ages 11-18, get connected by serving as an acolyte or helping as a youth mentor in our Godly Play class. Follow us on Instagram (cathedral.youth), and look for our monthly meetups after church on Sundays.
