


If elected President, I will engage with students, faculty, staff, and alumni to continue elevating the the part-time program's profile in the DC metro area and create the premier part-time MBA experience.




#### **Experience**

If elected Chief Marketing and Communications Officer, I will work hard to ensure that every member of every cohort feels informed and connected to all of the events and activities occurring in and around our community.


#### **Experience**


#### The Pitch


#### **Experience**



If elected VP of Baltimore, I will act on behalf of the Baltimore campus to plan fun and educational events that promote a sense of community.


#### **Experience**

If elected VP of D.C, I will work with my colleagues on the Board and campus personnel to ensure that the Smith experience is meeting the needs of the diverse interests of our class.


#### Experience
