...through the affectionate hug of Maximiliano, an-8-year-old boy who always says that he is not accepted by his classmates at his primary school, but he feels that he is loved here.



... when I hear Maylianay, an-11-year-old girl, crying. She deeply misses her grandmother who raised her. Her Christmases are "dark" because her grandmother died at Christmas time. Now Maylianay writes letters to relieve her pain and remember her grandmother not as someone who left, but as the one who gave her the best and most beautiful moments of her childhood.

... to help Luis Manuel, 10 years old, who worries because he gets regular grades in his school and because this makes his parents very angry. His eyes water because he was able to improve in some subjects. Luis Manuel wants to keep trying because this will give him the privilege to work together with his father every afternoon in the car sales business, not only to save money, but also to learn mechanics with him.



... through Enrique, also 10 years old, who worries constantly about his friends accepting him. Some kids resent him for following them around, so he looks for ways to engage with everyone. When he approached me about his worries, we had a chat on the swings. Now he uses the same place to chat with each of his friends.

... as I watch Aidan, because even if it is a cold or rainy day, he is one of the most faithful assistants in the class. This 8-year-old boy comes in the mornings and this year was his first time trying bagel bread. And although Santa Claus did not come to his house this Christmas, he feels very happy with the gift he received on Three Kings Day.
