FROM THE PASTOR...

Resolute in 2026...And Beyond

What is one of the best and worst things about a New Year? Resolutions. I try to make only 1 each year. I resolve, in the new year, to not make resolutions. I make that resolution, and I've already set myself up to succeed. The good part of a resolution? You've thought about it and determined that there is some part of you or your life in which you want to grow. A new year gives you a new chance to start that growth. The bad part of a resolution? There's a high likelihood that by February 1, that plan of growth is off track, or already left in the dust.

Don't get me wrong, thinking about you as a person or your life as a whole and wanting to grow in some area is admirable, noble. And I'm not saying all resolutions are discarded by February. Facilities/Properties

Allen and Shari Schroeder donated the 2025 Christmas tree for the Sanctuary. The Properties Committee and Band of Brothers Men's Bible Study installed and placed lights on the tree. Jen Effinger and Pastor Mayland organized a team of youth volunteers and their families to decorate both worship spaces and the common spaces. Kelly Peterson and Jan Haase do such a nice job of decorating the Lounge for all seasons, and this one is no exemption. The whole building looks lovely! Thank you to all of those whose time, talents and treasure prepared our church for Advent and Christmas.

November Financial Summary

Last year at the same time, we had significantly higher giving to tithes and offerings specifically. We had 5 Sundays in November, but only 4 Mondays. That may have impacted the bottom line this month. If that is the case, we should be much closer to budget after December.

In January, we begin the budget process because we have 6 months of data to consider. When we are under budget after 6 months in the fiscal year, it does impact the following fiscal year in the budget process. We will likely have a *more conservative* budget in the next cycle, given this year's financials. However, we will wait until January to be sure of that prediction.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We added a 5th line this year to reflect the school choice reserve liability. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

Childcare:

- Childcare income in November is still trending higher than budget. We have EXCELLENT staff members, and our focus (second to the children) is team building.
- When we have additional children, we often need additional staffing. We have hired 3 new staff members this month, and we hired a new Childcare Director.
- The bottom line for childcare was better than we expected.

School:

- School income in October was right where we expected it to be. Year-to-date is evening out as expected.
- Looking at the YTD bottom line, we are performing better than budget. This is important because some payroll expenses in the Elders section get transferred to the School before the end of the fiscal year (June). It is good to have a buffer here because the budget accounts for the expected transfers, but the actual expenses do not yet.
- We will have less support from the State to the School this year because the State cut some title funding from its budget. We previously used this money for staff education. We will be able to work with this in the next budget, but we need to look forward and plan for this moving forward.

Church:

Insurance costs are higher in the church than we budgeted. That can fluctuate year-to-year, depending on changes in circumstance or who is covered under each plan. A single plan, for example, is a lower cost than a family plan.

Overall:

- Overall, we are right where we expected to be at this point in the year (we are \$7,737 unfavorable to budget for the bottom line). That is not a bad place to be.
- As always, if you have an idea about how we can be practicing better stewardship of the congregation's funds, or
 if you feel that we are not being good stewards in one area or another, please discuss that with Chad Schwantes,
 Chairman of the Congregation (chairman@trinitynet.org). We strive to be good stewards of the LORD's gifts.

FINANCIALS—NOVEMBER 2025

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$49,885 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.
- Thrivent Loan: \$415,023 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!
- TOTAL Debt: \$464,908

Current account balances (as of Nov 30, 2025):

- -Checking: \$52,552 -Savings: \$479,420
- **Original Endowment: \$1,128,891 (Original Endowment that disburses annually based on percentages prescribed decades ago that does not change. You cannot donate to specific areas within this endowment. All income is prescribed just like the disbursements.)
- **Pegorsch Education Endowment: \$187,643 (Set up through Trinity by the Pegorsch children to fund Trinity tuition incurred by workers called to serve at Trinity. If there are no children of called workers, the annual disbursement can be used to cover Trinity early childhood or childcare tuition for called workers of Trinity).
- **Krienke Properties Endowment: \$107,219 (Set up through Trinity by George H. Krienke, DVM to fund Trinity properties projects that qualify as "capital projects." Disbursements will be banked year over year if there are no capital projects to fund in the disbursement year.)
- **Please note that you can donate to ANY of the 3 Endowments, so you should specify which endowment you are donating to in the memo line of your check. If you check memo says "Endowment," your donation will automatically go to the Original Endowment.

Millions of people around the world are blind or visually impaired & are seeking to strengthen their Christian faith but find it difficult to access scripture-based reading materials. Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) is committed to providing Christian materials in braille and specialized large print worldwide at no cost.

This \$100,000 grant will allow LBW to produce and freely distribute approximately 10,000 additional volumes of Bibles and other Christian materials. With a part of the grant funds, LBW will establish five new Ministry Production Centers in the United States. This is a mission that touches us locally. Trinity has a Blind Outreach luncheon and program bi-monthly. Greater Wausau Christian Services use the FREE LBW large print song books at all the senior living centers in the Wausau area as pastors provide a time of worship at their facility.

Many of us are finding larger print allows us to continue reading devotionals and scripture. A large print version of our bulletin is provided here at Trinity.
