Attendance Matters – Missing a day of school here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up!

When a student misses 2 days a month...They will miss 20 days a year. They will miss 20 hours of Math over the school year.

They will miss 60 hours of reading and writing over the school year. They will miss over 1 year of school by graduation.

When a student misses 4 days a month...They will miss 40 days a year. They will miss 40 hours of Math over the school year.

They will miss 120 hours of reading and writing over the school year. They will miss over 2 years of school by graduation.

MAP Testing for students in grades 5K - 8th grade will occur during the first three weeks of January. This is the 2nd round that indicates growth and needs from the preliminary tests in the fall. This data is helpful to both students and teachers. Goals can be reviewed and readjusted. Learning plans and interventions can be implemented. The final testing period is in May.
