

FROM THE PASTOR...

Seasons Change, But Not God

The well-known Byrds song, "Turn, Turn, Turn" is adapted from these verses from Ecclesiastes 3:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:
a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;
a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up;
a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together;
a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;
a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away;
a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;

a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

Each year, the earth God made goes through four seasons each with a different look and feel. Life itself goes through seasons, too. In our younger years we dream of what we will be when we grow up. In the midst of this, God reminds us He is with us to the end of the age. He says be still and know that He is God. As each season of life comes upon you, count on God seeing you through. Each season has a reason and a proper time for you because they are in His hands.

Earth's season is changing from summer to fall. Maybe you are experiencing a change in seasons in your life. Or maybe you feel like you're stuck in constant winter. Remember, there is a season for everything and a time for everything under heaven. God tells us these truths and He will be with you in all seasons and times.

Facilities/Properties

Our community partners at Crystal Finishing have stripped and powder coated the restroom partitions at the end of the Parlors Hallway! This was a much-needed update, and it is complete. We tested some new lock kits on the restroom partitions, and we like them so much that we are in process of replacing the locks on all restroom partitions over the next month.

The work on the new sound system in the Sanctuary will be completed in mid-October. We contracted with a company out of Fox Valley, Hull Audio, who specializes in sound systems in worship spaces. The update will include a complete overhaul of the system, including new speakers, wiring, sound mixer, and digital controls. Hull Audio customized our new system using a planning software that carefully considered the current Sanctuary dimensions and layout.

Council asked the Properties Committee to put together a new priority list. Keep in mind that many of us are here more frequently, and it becomes easy to overlook things that others may find important. If you have an idea of what should go onto that list, please email that to properties@trinitynet.org. These can be big things or small things.

August Financial Summary

While we ended our fiscal year in June at 100% of Tithes and Offerings, we definitely saw a decline in giving over the summer, and we have yet to see that recover in September. This may be because we have people who give at the end of the calendar year. It may be because Qualified Charitable Distributions are not coming until later in the year...or it may mean that giving is down. We will be keeping a close eye on that as the first quarter of the fiscal year comes to an end. We made staff wages a priority in this fiscal year, but right now we are struggling to meet that commitment.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We added a 5th line this year to reflect the School Choice Reserve Liability. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

Childcare:

- Childcare income in August was better than expected, a trend that we would like to see continue. We brought in \$10,000 more this month than the same month last year.
- When we have additional children, we often need additional staffing. As such, expenses were also more than expected.
- The bottom line for Childcare was nearly breakeven, as budgeted. This is very exciting because that includes operational/overhead costs.

School:

- School income in JULY was far above what we expected to see, so it is no surprise that the income in August is lower. Many families paid tuition for the whole year at registration, and that fell in July for most families.
- Looking at the YTD bottom line, we are performing \$50,000 better than budget.
- DPI changed the way it handles 4K School Choice, which will actually benefit us this year. That leads to a little more income in School Choice than we expected to receive this year.
- We will have less support from the State to the School next year because the State cut some Title funding from its budget. We previously used this money for staff education. We will be able to work with this in the next budget, but we need to look forward and plan for this moving forward.

Church:

We have a new service at 9:15am Sunday. The "modern" service intentionally "feels different" from the Saturday
Contemporary service, which is reminiscent of the old 10:40 service. The new service has all of the elements of
an LCMS service, but you might have to be very focused to recognize that. Don't get lost in the details...enjoy
worship.

Overall:

- Overall, we are right where we expected to be at this point in the year.
- As always, if you have an idea about how we can be practicing better stewardship of the congregation's funds, or

 Chairman of the Congregation (chairman@trinitynet.org). We strive to be good stewards of the LORD's gifts.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$53,304 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.
- Thrivent Loan: \$424,531 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!

• TOTAL Debt: \$477,835
