FROM THE PASTOR...

We're in the midst of Lent. Lent is a great time for us to focus upon both our sin and our Savior. It's a season of repentance and reflection. It's a time when many focus more time reading their Bible and doing daily devotions.

Our Sundays in Lent this year are from the gospel of Luke. A key passage in the book of Luke is 9:51 **"When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem."** Lk 9:51 introduces the travel narrative, which extends throughout the book of Luke. As a literary device, the journey provides a context suggesting movement, purpose, and destiny, and invites you to consider your own life journeys. The Lukan journey would have special impact on readers who recall God's guidance of His people Israel in the wilderness, or the journeys of Peter and Paul. Even Greco-Roman readers who understood the stories of Odysseus and Aeneas in travel narrative form may have found the journey context inspiring.

As Jesus sets His course toward Jerusalem, this verse marks a pivotal moment in the narrative of His ministry. It signifies a deliberate choice to journey toward the crucifixion, demonstrating His resolute commitment to fulfilling His mission as the Messiah. The phrase captures not only His physical path but also the spiritual weight of what lies ahead—suffering, rejection, and ultimately, His sacrifice for humanity. This transition foreshadows the challenges He will face, yet it also emphasizes the divine purpose underpinning His journey.

We see Jesus consciously embracing His impending passion, reflecting His understanding that such trials are integral to His redemption plan. The urgency and gravity of His mission become palpable as He prepares to face opposition from those who do not welcome Him, including the Samaritans who reject Him on account of His destination. This moment encourages believers to emulate Christ's steadfastness in the face of adversity, reminding us of the importance of perseverance and the higher calling that often accompanies personal sacrifices in our faith journey.

During Lent it's great to reflect on Jesus' journey through life, especially when He points us to His ultimate mission, His sacrifice upon the cross of Calvary. And then on Easter Sunday we get to hear the great story of the empty tomb and the resurrection. And we get to hear that great Easter proclamation: Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Facilities/Properties

We have paid the deposit for resurfacing the north parking lot, and we are currently waiting to be added to the schedule – prayerfully this summer.

We are in processes of applying for a Non-profit security grant. If awarded, this could provide Trinity (qualifying as a worship space) with enhanced security measures, including but not limited to additional cameras, outdoor lighting, upgraded badge readers, and some infrastructure changes. While we believe our security system to be well appointed, these upgrades would allow for more peace of mind for years to come.

The Leave a Legacy Benefit and Auction raised (after expenses) over \$30,000! Thank you to anyone and everyone who worked together to pull together the event, donated items or money, and enjoyed fellowship! This was our most abundant fundraiser in over 10 years! All proceeds will go to an estimated \$60,000 project to revamp the wireless internet and wiring in the building, supporting a technologically advanced learning environment.

February Financial Summary

We are maintaining over 100% of the budget for tithes and offerings 8 months into the fiscal year. In addition, this income is up about \$7,500 from last year at the same time. Thank you for your continued support of the staff, programs and services that we provide here. If we continue on this trend, we can make some ministry plans a reality.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the “bottom” line for each area within the church. We added a 5th line this year to reflect the School Choice Reserve Liability. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month’s financials include:

Childcare:

- Childcare operated at a significant loss (>\$10,000) last month. That should even out in March, as we collected past due accounts in early March.
- We on-boarded several staff in February. Some staff are currently working on certifications, which enhances the learning environment.

School:

- School financials look as expected. We are bringing in less than what we expected on the School Choice, but we knew that going into this year. Controlled expenses are assisting with the balance.
- Tuition will increase in the 2025-26 school year. This should not be a barrier to a Christian education – **families who are concerned about the increase are encouraged to apply for the Education Grant Fund**, which is in place to help offset the cost of tuition.
- Please help us spread the word about Trinity Lutheran School – you are our best advertisement during open enrollment, which is happening now.

Church:

- Tithes and Offerings: February income was higher than budget by 13%! Year-to-date, tithes and offerings are at 101% of budget! This is a far better position than we were in this time last year (91%). There is about a \$9,000 difference from last year-to-date at the same time.

Overall:

- Overall, we are right where we expected to be at this point in the year. That does not always happen, and we are grateful to the congregation for their continued generosity.

- As always, if you have an idea about how we can be practicing better stewardship of the congregation's funds, or if you feel that we are not being good stewards in one area or another, please discuss that with Chad Schwantes, Chairman of the Congregation (chairman@trinitynet.org). We strive to be good stewards of the LORD's gifts.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

Endowment Loan: \$60,435 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years – We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.

Thrivent Loan: \$443,272 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!

WOMEN IN MISSION NEWS

LWML Women's Fellowship will meet on **Tuesday, April 8 at 1:00pm** in the Parlors.

Trinity will be hosting the Zone 11 Spring Women in Mission Gathering on April 5. Our speaker is from Dakota Boys & Girls Ranch which is one of our national LWML mission grants.

At our March meeting, we completed 14 more “baby bottles” for Orphan Grain Train (OGT), bringing the total to 43! We had a lot of fun matching blankets with cute sleepers, adding cloth diapers, and pinning it all together. (Older moms and dads—you may remember those days using pins and cloth diapers.) OGT is a wonderful international charity that sorts, packs, and ships goods, clothing, medical equipment, school supplies, etc. to disaster areas of the US and worldwide. Go online to www.ogt.org to see all the things you can donate.

Our Women in Mission national convention will be June 26-29 in Omaha, NE. Our Zone 11 delegate, Lois Zahrt, and delegates from across the country will be voting to choose the new mission grants for the 2025-27 biennium. We will give you updates in July on the results.

Mission Grant #30 for \$100,000 “Washing by the Water and the Word”—Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) was founded in 2010 by Rev. Didanu and his wife, who came from Ethiopia to be missionaries to the unhoused in Sacramento, CA. In the past several years, the homeless population there has doubled to 10,000. Through MHM, they are able to purchase a portable two-stall shower trailer, where they can bring showers and the Gospel to parks, parking lots, and community locations where unhoused people live. Following a shower and being offered a haircut, people are given the opportunity to speak to someone who can listen to them, pray with them, and make referrals for other services. The grant will fund more frequent shower services, clean clothing, hygiene kits, as well as Bibles to give away.
