FROM THE PASTOR...

It's the most wonderful time of the year—or so we often hear people say as Christmas approaches. Perhaps it's because of the decorations that go up, the bright lights that make these long nights feel less dreary, or the extra time off later in the month. Of course, it doesn't hurt that *It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year* is a song first released by Andy Williams in 1963, and has since become a Christmastime classic.

The song itself celebrates and describes activities associated with the Christmas season, focusing primarily on gatherings of friends and families. Among the activities listed is the telling of "scary ghost stories," which I've always found a bit odd. Yet, it reflects a Victorian Christmas tradition that has mostly faded, though it survives in the enduring popularity of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*—with *The Muppet Christmas Carol* being, in my opinion, the best adaptation. Other activities mentioned include hosting parties, welcoming friends, enjoying universal gaiety, spending time with loved ones, sledding, roasting marshmallows, reminiscing about past Christmases, and singing carols in winter weather.

Whether these things are cherished memories or simply idyllic hopes for our own Christmas season, they certainly stir our sentimentality. Each year, Christmas seems to be the time when people are willing to go the extra mile to be with family and friends.

I must admit that Christmas is indeed a wonderful time of year. It is when we celebrate the incarnation of our Lord and Savior, Jesus. The Second Person of the Trinity has been present since creation: "God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light" (Genesis 1:3). The Gospel of John makes this even clearer: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God...And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:1–2, 14a).

Christ came to us as an innocent, helpless child. His birth was announced by angels to a handful of shepherds on the outskirts of town—not exactly the most honorific welcoming committee for the one who would live and die for our salvation. And yet, the infant Christ has been adored by countless generations. As the great philosopher Ricky Bobby humorously put it: "Well, look, I like the Christmas Jesus best when I'm sayin' grace. When you say grace, you can say it to Grown-up Jesus, or Teenage Jesus, or Bearded Jesus, or whoever you want."

Christmas is indeed a wonderful time of year. But is it truly the *most* wonderful? I would argue that another holiday deserves that title: Easter. Those three days from Good Friday to Easter Sunday are the most wonderful time of the year. It is then that our Savior laid down His life for our sins and rose again on Easter Sunday. That is where Christ won our salvation and reconciled us to God.

That being said, I hope you enjoy this wonderful time of year. Enjoy your decorations, your lights, your family, your traditions, and even your Christmas music (after Thanksgiving). I pray that you all have a Merry and Blessed Christmas during this wonderful season.


Youth of the Month

Facilities/Properties

The Stewart Avenue sign has a new look! This was a much needed update because we are no longer referred to as "Trinity on Stewart," and Trinity Childcare, as a function of the School, is no longer the Early Childhood Learning Center. We are simply "Trinity Lutheran Church & School." We are in process of evaluating the digital sign for replacement because the current sign is at end of life and is no longer eligible for service. The new sign will be animated and in color. You can donate to "digital sign" by memo on a check or giving envelope.

The elevator is leaking hydraulic fluid. The elevator maintenance company came out and tested the elevator, and it is testing like it should, but we know that the fluid is leaking into the ground underneath the cement pad. They are in process of quoting repairs for this, and it will be a big project. Look for more info about this in the yellow sheet in upcoming weeks. You may donate to "elevator repair" by memo on a check or giving envelope.

Council asked the Properties Committee to put together a new priority list. Keep in mind that many of us are here more frequently, and it becomes easy to overlook things that others may find important. If you have an idea of what should go onto that list, please email that to properties@trinitynet.org. These can be big things or small things.

October Financial Summary

By this time last year, we had significantly higher giving to tithes and offerings specifically - roughly \$33,000 higher. However, we cannot pinpoint why that is. The school is thriving; the childcare is thriving; we have added a modern service on Sundays; TLC Nights has been a huge outreach and educational opportunity for all ages; the expanded pastoral staff allows us to reach all of our congregation members who aren't physically in the building for worship; the sound system is a vast improvement; and there are new outreach opportunities for all ages and stages. In short, we are living the mission every day, and yet giving is down significantly.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We now have a 5th line to reflect the School Choice Reserve Liability. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

Childcare:

- Childcare income in October was higher than we expected it to be. We have EXCELLENT staff members, and our focus (second to the children) is team building.
- When we have additional children, we often need additional staffing. Expenses were right at budget.
- The bottom line for Childcare was better than we expected.
- Abby Northup has transitioned out of the role of Childcare Director to pursue an opportunity in healthcare. We are actively trying to find the right person to fill that vacancy.

School:

- School income in October was right where we expected it to be. Year-to-date is evening out as expected.
- Looking at the YTD bottom line, we are performing better than budget. This is important because some payroll expenses in the Elders section get transferred to the School before the end of the fiscal year (June). It is good to have a buffer here because the budget accounts for the expected transfers, but the actual expenses do not yet.
- We will have less support from the State to the School this year because the State cut some Title funding from its budget. We previously
 used this money for staff education. We will be able to work with this in the next budget, but we need to look forward and plan for this moving forward.
- The State has also fewer resources for speech therapy, which the Wausau School District used to provide in house at Trinity. They are still providing this service, but over a video call. Because of this change, we have increased teacher assistant hours to accommodate the service. This was not a budgeted expense, but it is necessary. It is a minimal expense.

Church:

- We have a new service at 9:15am Sunday. The "Modern" service intentionally "feels different" from the Saturday Contemporary service, which is reminiscent of the old 10:40 service. The new service has all of the elements of an LCMS service, but you might have to be focused to recognize that. Don't get lost in the details...enjoy worship.
- Another TLC Nights segment is complete! Thank you to everyone who contributed that is truly a commitment. The next segment will be
 after Christmas, and it will last 6 weeks. Look for more info to come through the Advent & Christmas seasons.

Overall:

 Overall, we are right where we expected to be at this point in the year (we are \$15,000 favorable to budget for the bottom line). That is something to celebrate.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

Thrivent Loan: \$418,202 → Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!

TOTAL Debt: \$469,420

Current account balances (as of Oct 31, 2025):

Checking: \$74,351 Savings: \$403,546

- **Original Endowment: \$1,118,778 (Original Endowment that disburses annually based on percentages prescribed decades ago that does not change. You cannot donate to specific areas within this endowment. All income is prescribed just like the disbursements.)
- **Pegorsch Education Endowment: \$186,133 (Set up through Trinity by the Pegorsch children to fund Trinity tuition incurred by workers call to serve at Trinity. If there are no children of Called Workers, the annual disbursement can be used to cover Trinity early childhood or childcare tuition for Called Workers of Trinity).
- **Krienke Properties Endowment: \$106,356 (Set up through Trinity by George H. Krienke, DVM to fund Trinity properties projects that qualify as "capital projects." Disbursements will be banked year over year if there are no capital projects to fund in the disbursement year.)
- **Please note that you can donate to ANY of the 3 Endowments, so you should specify which endowment you are donating to in the memo line of your check. If your check memo says "Endowment," your donation will automatically go to the Original Endowment.

The Christian is called to a life of expectant waiting, but during each Advent season, we especially emphasize this vigil. The word "Advent" means the arrival of a notable person or event. This 2025 season, we are using the hymn "Come Thou Long-Expected Jesus" (LSB 338) to focus on the arrival of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Advent is a season of expectant waiting. Christmas, or Cristes Mæsse, is only a few weeks away once the season begins. We also remember that the Church waits for the second Advent of Christ, when He will return in glory on the last day. Just as December 25th is certain to arrive, so too is Christ's return.

Our hymn serves as the foundation for our Wednesday service themes. (With Christmas Eve falling on a Wednesday this year, we've joyfully begun our Advent anticipation a week early—so we can fully celebrate the coming of our Lord together!) The excerpts of the hymn we will highlight are: "Born to set your people free," "Hope of all the earth Thou art," and "Rule in all our hearts alone." Each of these passages draws our attention to the aspirations of faithful followers of Christ.

Each of these themes will be examined through the lens of God's Word, the only rule and norm of our doctrine and practice. Through the Word preached the Holy Spirit will inform us of God's will for us. Through Him, we are truly free to love, He is our hope in every trial and every joy, and Christ alone is to rule our hearts! These themes will guide our church as we worship together during our midweek Advent services.
