

# **TRINITY HISTORY...DID YOU KNOW?**

John A. Kupsky, or known to so many as Mr. Kupsky, went to be with his Lord on Monday, June 20, 2022. John was a teacher at Trinity for 33 years and a faithful member until his passing. He was installed as 6th grade teacher on August 28, 1966. In addition to classroom teaching, he coached sports in the school, was the Superintendent of the Sunday School and Vacation Bible School (first one to use the system of moving mixed age groups from one station to the next) taught Bible classes, confirmation classes and early communion classes. He also set up the library and media center, made the first banners for the church sanctuary and made trips to Baraboo Circus World with his classes. He also served the North Wisconsin District of the LCMS by being the secretary of the first fulltime board of Camp Luther. John retired from teaching in 2000 after a 40 year teaching career. He continued to serve the church by singing in the sanctuary choir and helping with other ministries. Funeral services were held at Trinity Lutheran Church on Saturday, July 16, 2022.





- THE SANCTUARY/NARTHEX/LOUNGE RESTORATION PROJECT began May 16 and is moving right along as anticipated. Here
  is the progress!
  - ◆ Covering/sealing off the organ pipes completed May 17
  - ◆ Pew removal during construction completed May 21
  - Wall and ceiling repair in the entire Sanctuary completed July
  - ♦ Fan replacement completed June 17
  - Refinishing hardwood floors under the pews completed June 24
  - Asbestos removal (two relatively small areas) completed July 8
  - ♦ Replacement of pews completed July 16
  - Cleaning/Deodorizing/Scotch Guarding of pew cushions completed July 23
  - ◆ Carpet replacement in Sanctuary (to include Altar Guild room and behind partitions & Stewart Ave entrance) est. completion AUG 1
  - Uncovering/tuning organ/pipes Scheduled Aug 4
  - Cleaning of pews/balcony/window sills Scheduled Aug 11
  - ◆ Carpet replacement in Narthex, Lounge est. completion Aug 12

We are privileged to have the duty and responsibility to maintain God's house, and thanks to the generous contributions of our congregation, we will be able to do just that. What a joy it is to complete this project, which will maintain our beautiful worship space for future generations!

We look forward to returning to this beautifully restored space on August 20/21! Save the date!

- LEGACY DOLLARS HARD AT WORK! Mike Hase and company began installing the 2nd sets of security doors in July. This project is nearing completion and should be ready prior to the start of school! The second set of security doors so that elevators and restrooms can be used when we hold church events without compromising the security in the school and child-care. This will be fully funded with Legacy Auction dollars that were raised in 2019 and 2021.
- Finally, the Gym floors were stripped down to the original wood, sanded, and repainted with the Trinity Athletics eagle logo in the center. The finished product is stunning, and we are excited to show off the updated Gymnasium when school starts in Fall 2022.

#### **June Financial Summary**

June financials showed consistently generous offerings from members of the congregation. The chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from June financials include:

- Childcare update:
  - We continue to lose Childcare staffing due to normal turnover mixed with low wages, despite an increase in wages in September. Due to the challenges in staffing, we are operating at a lower capacity with respect to students. This is having a big negative impact on the bottom line. We do have something in the works to help this. That plan has been communicated to staff, and they expressed understanding and are on board.
  - Childcare is actually *budgeted* to lose about \$57,000/year, a dollar amount which is covered as a ministry of the church. We will lose more than that this year.
  - Childcare hosted a *very successful* Carnival as an Outreach/fundraising event to help offset this loss by roughly \$10,000.
- School is not expected to meet the income side of budget this year due to the loss of a few WPCP students. These students
  moved out of the area this Summer, and others chose to attend a different school in the program. We are losing 2 more
  WPCP students this school year for various reasons. This is offset by the expense side being lower than expected, so the
  school is in a good position.
- Tithes and Offerings are under budget for June and only 3% under budget for the year. This is not a bad place for us to end the fiscal year.

## **JUNE 2022 FINANCIALS**

- Tithes and Offerings to the general fund are the main source of income. Along with tithes and offerings, childcare tuition (which is 53% of budget right now), WPCP (which is down due to the aforementioned decreases) and school tuition all go to regularly budgeted salaries, benefits, supplies and operating costs (utilities, maintenance, cleaning supplies, etc.). As you can imagine, utilities and supply costs are increasing across the board as a result of inflation.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
  - ◆ Endowment Loan: \$103,194 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years!
  - ◆ Thrivent Loan: \$560,297 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!
  - **◆** TOTAL Debt: \$663,491 ← Last month this was \$673,791

#### **Current account balances:**

- Checking: \$65,982
- Savings: \$534,386 (This will go down significantly over the next month as we pay for the capital projects that are happening.)
- Endowment: \$798,812 (As you can imagine, the current market is not good for our Endowment. We expect this to go back up when the economy bounces back, but we are watching it closely.)

IMPORTANT NOTE: The current financial report is in its PRELIMINARY form because this is the end of the fiscal year. There are many journal entries that need to be made prior to the audit on August 15/16, including but not limited to:

- Transfer of salaries and benefits for those of us who are shared between church, school and childcare (Church Admin, as well as Pastors, Director of Music, and DCE who teach in the school).
- Other shared allocations
- Annual church support to the school this is expected to be around \$375,000 this year.
