As a result of our staff growth over the last several months we are pleased to announce that our 2 and 3 year old classrooms currently have room for new students. These spaces are limited and we expect these high-demand spots to fill up fast!

UPDATES

The School Board, in collaboration with the Board of Elders, chose to rewrite the position description of Childcare Director. That change was made with prayerful consideration of the future direction and needs of Trinity Lutheran Church & School. The new position will be ministry-driven with a focus on education, which is a shift of thought from a Childcare Director with a goal to push families towards the church. This was presented to the congregation in an Assembly of the Voters on Tuesday, September 12. The congregation, at that meeting, voted to issue a Call to Shelly McMullen.

Shelly received the Call papers on Thursday, September 14 and is prayerfully deliberating the Call as DCE - Family Ministry/Childcare Director. This is a 40%/60% split in theory. In practice, the director will be available throughout the week to Childcare staff, with a focus on staff needs, development, tools and equipment needed in the department, and overall direction of the department, in addition to a heavy children's ministry presence. Please pray for Shelly during this deliberation period as she contemplates a move from Texas. Her decision will be announced in church following receipt - this could take a few weeks. We will then update staff via email of that decision.

The School Board has asked School Board member Marie Traska to serve as a point-person for the Childcare Staff so that they have a sounding board for major concerns. Tina/Jen will continue to manage day-to-day operations in the childcare. This will, however, allow Marie (as a Board member) to hear the concerns and delegate as appropriate. *Marie has not taken on an Interim Director role, but rather will serve as a Board resource to the childcare staff.*

In May, we had 7 Childcare staff...we currently have 21 Childcare staff! It has been a busy Summer on-boarding and training new staff - that is a LOT of work for our staff who were here before. That doesn't count the people we have on-boarded who didn't work out (of which there is a healthy handful).

Please continue to pray for our Childcare staff...many are still training, we have people with medical concerns and family struggles, and it still feels like a period of chaos. Any support or encouragement you can offer them would be appreciated.

We are back into the swing of things here at school and already having some fun mixed in with the learning we do.




Grade 4K and 5K took a trip to the Apple farm.

Confirmation

We are looking forward to a great year of sharing and growing our faith in Jesus Christ with this year's 7th & 8th graders, as well as learning about the privileges and responsibilities of an adult Christian life in Christ.

The Rite of Confirmation for our Jr. Confirmands will happen on Sunday, October 29th during the 9:00am Divine Service. Our students' Capstone Projects will also be on display in the lounge that morning. In September we had our annual Confirmation Retreat where time was spent reviewing all that had been learned about the Christian faith over the past years as well as a time of examination. Confirmation is a custom of the Church and not a sacrament. It links the catechumens to their Baptism, celebrates the hearing of the Lord's Word among them and affirms their continued reception to the Lord's Table. Confirmation declares of a catechumen that he or she is a Christian who has been baptized, confesses the faith, and is in communion with Christ and His Church. Confirmation assumes that ongoing catechesis is the way of life for the faithful Christian. This rite emphasizes God's work in Baptism, the gift of faith, and the benefits of the Lord's Supper for all who believe in Christ and the words of His testament. Our congregational family is asked to be vigilant in prayer for these students that God would continue to keep them in the one true faith and that they would continue to be faithful in attending the Divine Service where God's gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation are freely given through His Word and Sacraments.

*THE LORD'S SUPPER IN WORSHIP Good news! Starting in October, Trinity will begin offering the Lord's Supper at every worship service. Why would we do this? First, the Lord's Supper, where you receive the true body and blood of Christ, is a precious gift which gives forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation. Second, it's Scriptural. In the New Testament there is no mention of Sunday services without a mention of the Lord's Supper. Third, Communion is the most visible way that we can see Christ in our worship service. We hear His Word preached every week, so why wouldn't we want to also sense (see, smell, taste, feel) His forgiveness as well to engage all five senses.

Facilities/Properties

The Brick Restoration Project of 2023 is complete! Our community partners at Miron were a blessing to work with, and we are very pleased with the results. Miron came under budget for the project, so we were able to complete a few items that were not in the original bid and stay under the approved amount. There are a few items left to complete the project: caulking around doors, windows and concrete joints; lighting the arch at the main entrance on Stewart Ave; and gutter replacement on the east wall of the Gym. These are additional costs, but they are operational in nature.

We have new LED lighting on the exterior of the building. This is going to save us money over time, but it will also brighten the exterior, making it safer around the campus. The congregation funded this project last year.

The YAT House got a slight facelift. There was broken plaster in the ceiling that was repaired, and there is a fresh coat of paint coming to that area and adjacent areas soon.

Trinity is working to obtain some quotes for special projects, including carpet throughout the school and childcare, carpet in the church and school office/workroom, and resurfacing the parking lots. We are also looking at quotes for the woodwork on the exterior of the church, which would be the last phase of the exterior restoration. Once we have an opportunity to prioritize the needs, we plan to present them to the congregation.

Childcare Update

The congregation met on September 12th and voted to issue a Call to Shelly McMullen for the role of Childcare Director...but wait, there's more! Prior to that, the School Board and the Board of Elders chose to make this a Ministry-driven position with a focus in Childcare Admin. The Call is for a DCE of Family Ministry/ Childcare Director. The goal is to help us grow young family ministry through both Family Ministry and the Childcare. If Shelly does not accept the Call, the School Board and Elders are committed to this model for the position moving forward.

Please pray for Shelly and her family as she deliberates the Call to Trinity; and please continue to pray for our hard-working Childcare staff – they have tripled in number since May!

August Financial Summary

We currently have 60 students enrolled through School Choice and a total of 175 students. This is a double-edged sword.

For every School Choice student, Trinity will receive \$9,800 (an increase of \$1,500/student from last year) in the *current* school year. School Choice participation requires that we spend that \$9,800/student per year on each School Choice student, *and* \$9,800/student on each of our tuition paying students. Family paid tuition is *at most* \$2,800/student for *members* and \$4,500 for *non-members* (*or members who do not meet attendance requirements). The congregation pays *at least* \$7,000/student for *members* and \$5,300/student for *non-members**. This year, we need to spend roughly \$160,000 more than we needed to spend last year to stay compliant with this program – that is a BIG challenge when we try to keep tuition low for our families and cannot cover that additional expense with current tithes and offerings. We are in process of evaluating how to bring in more income to cover this. Our main sources of income are offerings and family paid tuition.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

Childcare:

- We have on-boarded roughly 20 staff members in the last 5 months. That means our staff members who were here in May have trained about 15 (because 5 have not worked out for various reasons). This is a LOT of work for those staff members to do while they are taking care of children. Please thank them when you have an opportunity.
- We are still in a period of transition with training, and we need to be fully staffed to add more children. But we need more students to offset the cost of additional staff. We are getting there, but it is taking more time than originally anticipated.
- While Childcare is operating at a deficit greater than expected, we are trending upward. It is important that we give the staff the time they need to be fully trained. We will get there.

FINANCIALS—AUGUST 2023

School:

- ♦ See the above note regarding School Choice and the impact on finances this year. This is incredibly important and should be on everyone's radar.
- ♦ School financials look great right now because we collected tuition/fee payments in July and August. We are scheduled to receive the first School Choice payment in late September, which should help with some cash-flow issues right now.

• Church:

↑ Tithes and offerings have fallen to 88% of budget in the first 2 months of the fiscal year and \$7,600 lower than last year's giving at the same time in the year. This is alarming. That is \$3,800 per month less that we have to spend on ministry. This trend coincides with the announcement of the Estate gifts back in February. If we cannot correct this as a congregation, we will have to reserve the Estate gifts for operational expenses, for which they should not be used. If you have an idea about how we can be practicing better stewardship of the congregation's funds, or if you feel that we are not being good stewards in one area of another, please discuss that with Chad Schwantes, Chairman of the Congregation:

OVERALL:

Overall, we are in a good financial position ending August, but the downward trend of Tithes and Offerings is a big concern. As we try to grow ministry, we are concerned about having the resources to allocate to areas of interest. In short, people of the congregation want to see Trinity serving people in a meaningful way, but we don't currently have the resources to do everything we want to do.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$85,526 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years —We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.
- Thrivent Loan: \$513,329 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015! We fully anticipate this being below \$500,000 this time next year.
- TOTAL Debt: \$598,855 ⓒ
