

## FROM THE PASTOR...

Grace to you and peace from God our Father, and the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. AMEN!

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." - Galatians 5:13-14

Here we are in the month of July. The year is half over. Summer is now upon us. July always brings back fond memories of childhood for me: fireworks, barbecues, parades, carnivals. It was always hot and humid in Iowa. Independence Day and the celebration of freedom. That's what it was all about.

We can never read it or ponder over it too much; for the more we deal with it, the more precious it becomes and the better it tastes." With that in mind, we will be focusing on the book of Romans for our preaching this summer.

So as you gather with family and friends to celebrate this summer, whether it be for the Fourth of July, a family reunion, or simply an excuse to get together and barbecue, be sure to invite your Lord and Savior to be a part of your celebration. After all, it was His death that truly won us our freedom to live as children of God and to serve one another through love.



## Staffing Update

We continue to welcome new staff members onto our childcare team throughout the summer. We are blessed to have more than doubled our childcare staff over the last several months. We are currently working on training and onboarding these staff members with the hope of bringing more students into the center beginning this fall. Please continue to pray for our childcare staff and students as we embark on this period of change and growth. If you are a qualified childcare provider interested in joining our team we urge you to apply online at indeed.com by searching Trinity Lutheran Church and School.

## **Summer Scheduling**

School-age families using summer care must have each week's schedule turned in no later than the Wednesday of the week before care is needed. Please fill out a schedule update slip located on the counter as you enter the classroom or email Jen in the Church office at effingerj@trinitynet.org. A 24-hour cancellation notice is required. If we do not hear from you, you will be charged for the time you were scheduled. If your child is dropped off without prior notification, they may not be able to participate in planned activities.

## **Payments**

Childcare Payments are due weekly. A secure drop box is located in the lobby just inside Door #1 for your convenience. Payments and donations can be dropped here securely any time. You can also make online gifts or payments at trinitywausau.org under the GIVE tab. Please remember service fees are applicable when using a credit card on our online portal. Any payments will be applied to your childcare tuition balance less the service fee.

### Breakfast, Lunch and a Snack

Every day your child is scheduled for childcare or summer school-age care they are eligible for FREE breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack. A menu of what will be served will be available on a weekly basis throughout the summer. Breakfast will be served to all children scheduled to be present for care at 8am. You are welcome to pack your child a cold lunch (and decline the Trinity provided lunch) should you so choose. Our Wednesday lunch will generally be a cold sandwich option to give classrooms an option to have an outdoor lunch on those days. Older students may participate in walking field trips to the Wausau farmers' market throughout the summer where our staff will be purchasing produce to be used in this food program when available. The more accurate your child's daily schedule is, the easier it is for us to plan for meal numbers and avoid food waste, so please communicate late arrivals, early departures or schedule changes with your child's classroom staff or the church office. We are very excited to launch this new program and happy to answer any questions you may have along the way.

### Vacation Bible School August 7th - 11th

We are in need of volunteers and supply donations to make our event a success. We are accepting donations now through August 1st. # **CHURCH ADMINISTRATOR, TINA DICKENS**

### **Facilities/Properties**

Brickwork began May 30 and should last throughout the Summer, ending just before school begins. There have been some minor delays as a result of a brick-layers union strike, back ordered brick, etc., but the schedule seems to be moving along smoothly. We ordered 3 different colors of brick to match as closely to the existing brick as possible. Please be patient as we navigate this large-scale project that will change how the community sees Trinity.

### **May Financial Summary**

Preliminary financials show that May was more consistent with what we budgeted than the 2 months prior. We ended May at 95% of Tithes and Offerings budget, which is much lower than last year at this time. We are currently looking at why Tithes and Offerings dipped *significantly* in March and April, which is not characteristic of our Springs of years past.

The chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

### Childcare:

We are currently operating at 95% of our income budget, but our expense budget for the year is 98%. We expect this to change dramatically when we bring on more children in childcare in August/September.

### School:

May shows a trend in school financials that we expected. We have less School Choice students than we budgeted, and that impacts the bottom line. There isn't much we can do to change the expenses in the school for this budget year, so we need to be creative about how to cover this deficit. Cash flow is not a problem right now, so we are not sounding any alarms. This will be dramatically different next year due to higher school enrollment.

### • Church:

- ♦ Tithes and offerings increased to 95% of budget after May.
- We have seen some generous gifts to restricted accounts in the past couple of months...while this is very helpful when we have specific needs, it is hard to concentrate funding to areas of special interest when we aren't meeting budget, which considers monthly bills, salaries/benefits, school advancements, and support for the childcare. Please consider giving to the general fund when you are able...we are committed to being good stewards of your generous gifts. Restricted gifts cannot be used for budgeted items.

### OVERALL:

Overall, we are in an unfavorable position at this point in the financial year. We need to see some improvement, or we will have to make some significant changes to our expense line.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$87,525 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.
- Thrivent Loan: \$521,965 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015! We fully anticipate this being below \$500,000 this time next year.

TOTAL Debt: \$609,490
