

How Now Shall We Live?

It is a question God would pose to each of us. It is the query found in the above title.

A chapter from God's Word gives one set of directives. This is Romans 12.

It begins with an emphasis on being fully devoted to God and His will for our lives (vv.1-3). Paul goes on to reflect on the spiritual gifts given by the Holy Spirit that point us to the work we are to fulfill in the kingdom of God (vv.4-8).

Paul concludes this chapter with what are called "Marks of the True Christian" (vv.9-21). Included are attributes of-love...showing honor...service to the Lord...rejoicing...living peaceably with all...and overcoming evil with good.

Imagine the difference that would result if everyone lived this way. It is the responsibility of each person to decide how they will live. A central focus is to bring honor to God through our words and action. Yes, people are listening and watching. They will know we are Christians by how we now live.

Thank You: The childcare would like to extend a big thank you to the members of the congregation for supporting the childcare financially. The childcare has been an outreach for the

church and school for almost 30 years. The last couple years have been tough due to the effects of CoVID on enrollment and staffing. We pray that you will continue to support the childcare to help us reach these families and teach them about the love of Jesus. If you have it upon your heart to make a specific donation to the childcare, please let the church office know.

ECC Registration: There is no school on January 17th for teacher in-service. All-day childcare will be provided for school-age children. Advanced registration is required. Watch for a sign-up sheet on the parent clipboard or email the Childcare Director at swansonp@trinitynet.org.

TRINITY HISTORY...DID YOU KNOW?

The history of our congregation is so rich and valuable. Through it we are able to see how faithful God has been to his people. It serves as a reminder that if he has been faithful to us in the past he will certainly be faithful to us in the future. Enjoy! God bless, Rick Stengl, DCE

Did you know...On November 24, 1900 a small school house on County Road NN in Rib Mountain was purchased by Zion Lutheran Church for use as a mission church. Then in 1908, after Trinity Lutheran Church was founded by Zion, Trinity took over the mission church and supplied her with their pastors. In 1910 the name of the congregation was changed to Bethlehem Lutheran Church. Our very own Rev. J. Th Destinon served Bethlehem from 1908 until 1916, Rev. Fred Forster served from 1916 until 1919 and then Rev. E. H. Bertermann served from 1919 until 1965. In the early years Pastor Bertermann rode a bicycle to the services in the summer and rented a horse to travel to services in the winter. Later he received a Model T Ford to travel more easily to the Sunday afternoon services. Over the years Pastor Bertermann took a very special interest in the little church. He saw to it that pine trees were planted on the property and he was known to haul water in barrels on a trailer behind his car to water the trees and see to it that they got off to a good start. A small cemetery grew next to the church and over the years some of the original members and their descendants have been placed there to rest until the resurrection. The final regular service at Bethlehem was conducted on January 1, 1965. The congregation was dissolved after a new church, Rib Mountain Lutheran Church, was built nearby. In August of 1975, following the death of Pastor Bertermann, a special service was conducted and Bethlehem Lutheran Church was dedicated to his memory. The church was officially renamed "The Bertermann Memorial Chapel" with Pastor Bertermann's daughter, Cecelia Pieper, serving as the organist for the special service. The chapel and the grounds around it continue to be preserved and cared for by descendants of former members of the church...now you know!



The exterior of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in 1944. The building had been constructed in 1890 on a half-acre of land that had been donated by Mr. and Mrs. Julius Wittke. The building, originally built to serve as a school house, came at a cost of \$151.

Your blessings flow—


In the form of shattered cross and empty tomb; in the form of clean hearts and heaven forever.

Facilities/Properties

In process:

- We are in process of evaluating carpet samples for replacing the carpet in the Sanctuary. It would be ideal to replace the carpet in the Narthex and Lounge at the same time, but we do not yet have the full funding for that part of the project. We currently have about \$7000 for carpet outside of the Sanctuary carpet project. The Sanctuary carpet project is fully funded. Any donations marked "carpet" will go towards the Narthex and Lounge carpet until those areas are fully funded.
- We have a secured grant for the school that will provide our students an enhanced experience. One of the needs in the school is replacing the classroom flooring with a long-lasting rubber flooring tile, and we are in process of determining if that qualifies for grant funding. We are hoping to find a product that will withstand normal wear, make cleaning more efficient and more effective, and reflect the caring learning environment that we offer.

We are looking at a few major projects over the next two years that will total over \$250,000 – these projects include brick restoration, more ceiling and wall restoration in the Sanctuary, and flooring as mentioned above. If you feel passionate about facility updates, you can give to "Building Restoration," which will help fund these upcoming projects. We currently have about \$37,000 in the Building Restoration Fund to be used for future projects.

We extend a BIG THANK YOU to Allen and Shari Schroeder for the beautiful Christmas tree in the Sanctuary, and to our Properties Committee for making an event of harvesting the tree and putting it up. We also thank the Stengl family for thoughtfully decorating the tree using traditional Chrismons made by Barb Storch.

November Financial Summary

November financials showed consistently generous offerings from members of the congregation. This will position us well for the first 6 months of the financial year. Highlights from November financials include:

- Childcare update:
 - We continue to lose Childcare staffing due to normal turnover mixed with low wages, despite an increase in wages in September. Due to the challenges in staffing, we are operating at a lower capacity with respect to students. This is having a big negative impact on the bottom line.
 - Childcare is actually budgeted to lose about \$57,000/year, which is covered as a ministry of the church. We do not have the money to cover loss above and beyond that budgeted amount. If loss is projected above that budgeted amount, we need a plan of correction.
 - ♦ We are currently projected to lose \$87,700 this fiscal year. That is a \$37,000 loss above budget.
- School is not expected to meet the income side of budget this year due to the loss of a few WPCP students. These students moved out of the area this Summer, and others chose to attend a different school in the program. We are potentially losing 2 more WPCP students this school year.
- Tithes and Offerings are 2% over budget for November and now only 2% under budget for the year in the first five months. Keep in mind that Tithes and Offerings to the general fund are a main source of income. Along with tithes and offerings, childcare tuition (which is only about 62% of budget right now), WPCP (which is down due to the aforementioned decreases) and school tuition all go to regularly budgeted salaries, benefits, supplies and operating costs (utilities, maintenance, cleaning supplies, etc.). As you can imagine, utilities and supply costs are increasing across the board. Please pray that we are able to continue to take care of our staff while providing parishioners, students and missions with the resources and programs that enrich their lives.
