He is present in every baptized believer. His mission was outlined by Christ.

Now may be the time to do more than "take note." Now is the time to "take notes" regarding the Holy Spirit's mission for your life.

The Gospel of John gives an overview of the Holy Spirit's work. Jesus shared this insight with His disciples before His Passion (John 14-16). Here is a summary of the Spirit's work through believers—

- John 14:25-26—He will teach you all things and bring to remembrance Jesus' teachings.
- John 15:26-27—He will help bear witness of Christ.
- John 16:7-15—He will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment...and to declare the things that are to come.

To get a picture of the Spirit in action read the book of Acts. It will bring the insights from John to life as you witness the work of the apostles who were empowered by the Holy Spirit to be witnesses for Christ (Acts 1:8).

What becomes clear from these Bible verses is that the Spirit is a "shaker and a mover." The Holy Spirit makes things happen in continuing the plans Christ began while here on earth. His work, done largely through the church, was meant to change the world...to save the world.

This is to take place through empowered messengers for Christ. We have a story to tell regarding our crucified and resurrected Savior. The dying world needs to hear and appreciate John 3:16—

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

These remain ancient words with no impact unless they are shared. The Holy Spirit is fully available to bring those words to life...and to bring hearers to become saved believers. We are united in the Spirit to bring this to fruition.





One of the newest features of our website, which we did not have before, is the ability for people to donate electronically to our organization conveniently with a click on the "Donate" button.

We will have the support of our website designer for one year, paid for by an anonymous donor. MISSION: Greater Wausau Christian Services is a cooperative mission of area congregations dedicated to offering Christian ministry to individuals and their families while those individuals are residents in nursing homes, assisted care facilities, the county jail, or the county juvenile center.









The Appalachian Servant Event (ASE) is the longest running high school servant event in the LCMS, and Trinity has sent a group ever since its beginning in 1983. The event had been cancelled in 2020 and 2021, so it was good to return to serving! The event requires participants to have high maturity and high responsibility. Light construction, painting, cleaning, and extreme digging of septic sites are the typical work experiences each year. Although smaller this year, the event typically includes 50 youth and adults from across the country spending nearly two weeks serving the people of Asheville, NC. The youth who go to ASE make a difference in the lives of people through their meaningful work and they make friends they may keep for a lifetime. Most importantly, the people who attend this event leave with a deep connection to their Savior's servant sacrifice for them and are encouraged to continue to be Christ's hands and feet back at home. After months of worshipping in the Spiritual Life Center, we returned as a congregation to the fully restored Sanctuary Saturday, August 20 and Sunday, August 21. It was a beautiful service, and we worshipped roughly 400 that weekend. Prayerfully everyone enjoyed the improvements to the Sanctuary, Narthex and Lounge.

We extend many thanks to our community partners at Thorson, Macco's, Sons of the Carpenter, Stanley Steemer, and Dean Christian, whose talents contributed to the restoration. We extend special thanks to the men, women and children of the congregation who moved pews, cleaned, prepared the spaces for opening weekend on request. We extend gratitude for the members of the Properties Committee, who feel truly blessed to be a part of this project, but who also bless us. And we give great thanks to those whose generosity made the scope of this project possible. May you all continue to be blessed to be a blessing.

In progress:

LEGACY DOLLARS HARD AT WORK! Mike Hase and company completed the 2nd sets of security doors in July. This
project is experiencing some delays in supply chain, so we are waiting on some security elements. The project is
expected to be completed by mid-September! The second set of security doors allows for the elevators and restrooms to be used when we hold church events without compromising the security in the school and childcare.
This is fully funded with Legacy Auction dollars that were raised in 2019 and 2021.

July Financial Summary

July financials showed consistently generous offerings from members of the congregation. The chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from July financials include:

- Childcare:
 - o Childcare has been struggling to stay ahead of budget post CoVID. Keeping Childcare staff is a challenge due to rising wages and our ability to meet the economic demand. This year's budget reflects that.
 - o On a high note, Childcare was budgeted to lose money in July, but we did not lose as much as was expected. This is a better trend than what we have seen in previous months.
- School:
 - o Registration took place in July this year, so July financials are looking great in the school! This will even out over the year, as we brought in more money at registration than was budgeted, which likely means that families chose to pay more up front than stretch it out over the course of the year.
- Tithes and Offerings are under budget for July by 8%. This is not surprising for July, which tends to be the lowest month of the year.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$102,111 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal
 of paying it back in 15 years!
- Thrivent Loan: \$557,540 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!
- TOTAL Debt: \$659,651 ← Last month this was \$663,491

JULY 2022 FINANCIALS

Current account balances:

- Checking: \$34,233
- Savings: \$534,386 (This will go down significantly over the next month as we pay for the capital projects that are happening.)
- Endowment: \$798,812 (As you can imagine, the current market is not good for our Endowment. We expect this to go back up when the economy bounces back, but we are watching it closely.)

Annual support to the school was \$485,000 in Fiscal Year '22 (ending June 30).

SEPTEMBER CHALLENGE Have someone over for dinner! Get to know someone at church the way that Jesus would have...over a meal. Ask someone at your Bible Study, on your pew, or someone whose children go to Sunday School with you to join you for dinner!
