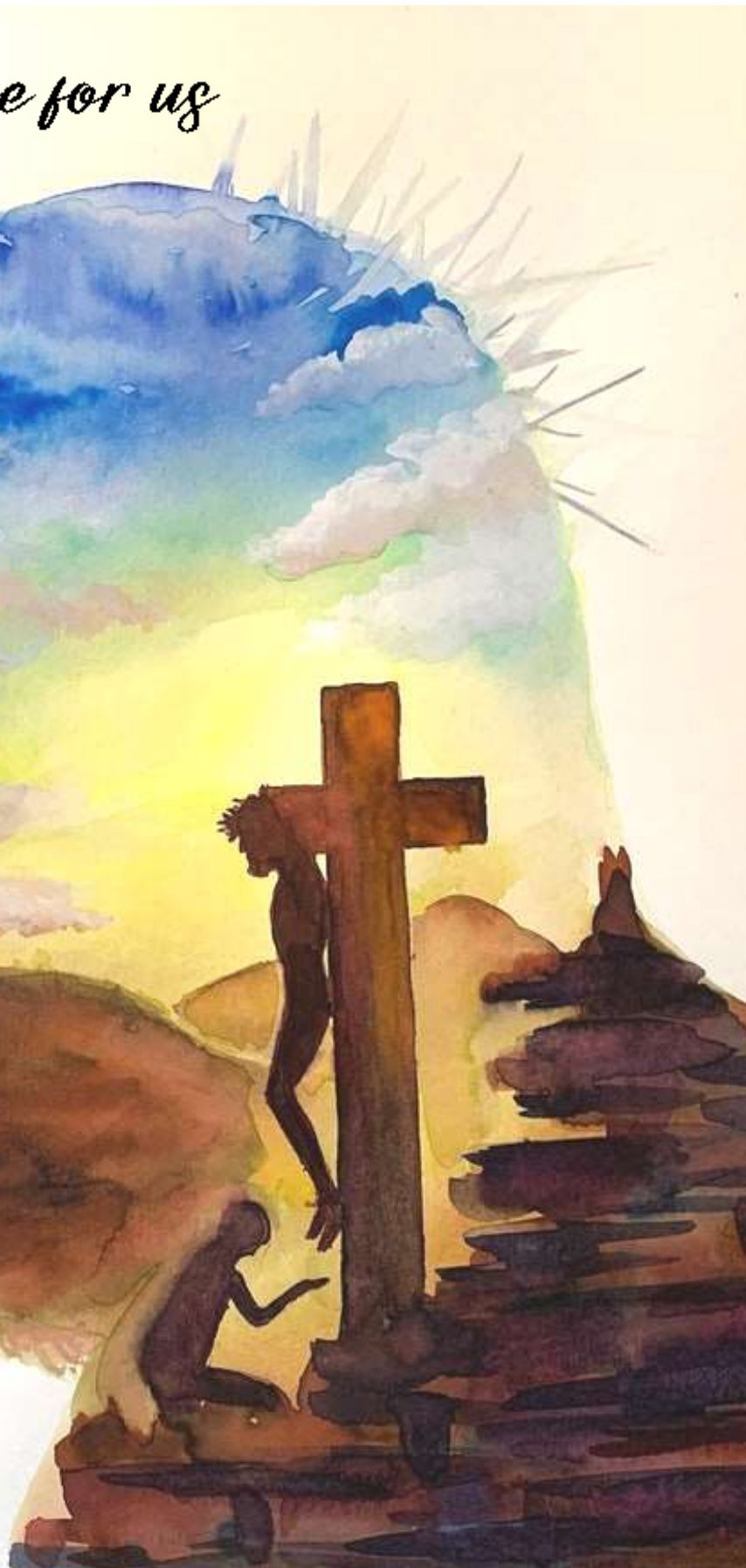

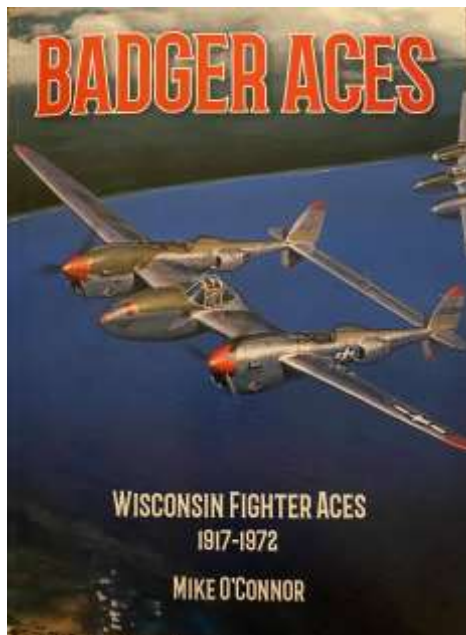

- How vision, hearing, medication, footwear, strength, and balance affect your risk of falling

- Use a walker indoors or a wheelchair full-time

Is the Great Commission still a central part of the spiritual life of churchgoers today?

In a recent Barna survey, over 50% of U.S. churchgoers were not sure if they had heard of the Great Commission, and another 25% couldn't recall the meaning.

There are over 2 billion unreached people around the world. How urgent is it to reach them?

Only 53% of U.S. churchgoers thought this was "urgent," and the remaining 47% thought it was only somewhat or not urgent.

Facilities/Properties

We're taking a breather on major facilities projects right now...but don't hold your breath! We are in progress of gathering quotes for the following projects, which we hope to complete in 2023:

- Brick restoration on the front of the church!
- Solid surface poured rubber flooring for the playgrounds (thanks to funds from a private donor, Legacy 2022, and Alumni)

December Financial Summary

December financials showed consistently generous offerings from members of the congregation. The chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from December financials include:

- Childcare:
 - ◇ On a high note, Childcare is performing better to budget this year than expected. This trend is going in the right direction.
 - ◇ We were able to bring on new staff in December, which should allow us to bring on additional children in Childcare. As a result, we granted increases for Lead Teachers, Childcare Teacher Assistants, and School Teacher Assistants to a wage that is closer to current market standards
 - ◇ ***Please read Penny's article for an update on staffing.***
- School:
 - ◇ We have less Parental Choice students than what we budgeted, and this impacts the School's income significantly. If you look at the year-to-date school income, we are almost \$40k lower than we budgeted. We are committed as a congregation to educating the students of Trinity at a high standard spiritually and academically. This decrease in income does not change the expense side of the budget, so we have to be creative about how to make up for this loss in income on the church side.
- Church:
 - ◇ Tithes and offerings are 95% of budget after December, which is consistent with previous months. This is lower than what we would expect to see after Christmas (last year we were at 98% of budget after Christmas).
 - ◇ We have seen some generous gifts to restricted accounts in the past couple of months...while this is very helpful when we have specific needs, it is hard to concentrate funding to areas of special interest when we aren't meeting budget, which considers monthly bills, salaries/benefits, school advancements, and support for the childcare. Please consider giving to the general fund when you are able...we are committed to being good stewards of your generous gifts.

We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:

- Endowment Loan: \$96,657 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years
- Thrivent Loan: \$543,633 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!
- **TOTAL Debt: \$640,291**
