FROM THE PASTOR...

Romans1:8 First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. ⁹ For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you ¹⁰ always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you. ¹¹ For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you— ¹² that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, Paul speaks of his desire to go to Rome and meet his fellow Christians there. What a glory we would bring to the gospel of Christ, that he forgives us our sins by the sacrifice of his life on the cross, when we increase our fellowship even more still. What a blessing of Christ himself to pray for one another.

Is there someone in the congregation that needs your prayer? Is there someone in the congregation that you are thankful for? Is there a fellow Christian and partner in the gospel that our Lord is placing on your heart today? Be thankful for all of these and any other things God places on your heart.

This Lenten season let us devote ourselves to thankfulness for our congregation and those in it. God's peace to you this Lententide.

Tax Forms – Brightwheel offers an easy to download, year-end tax statement right in your account that was made available in January 2025 for the 2024 tax year. The statement includes the provider's Employer Identification Number (EIN) and all payment activity by all payers for a student in a given tax year. This can be found under the Statements tab of your account on the web and mobile app. Statements for payments made before our transition to the Brightwheel platform were sent to you during the month of January via email.

Winter Weather – Trinity Childcare strives to be open when the school is closed for inclement weather. When weather is severe, look for notifications on WAOW and WSAW, as well as our social media platforms, Facebook and Instagram, or on our website,

www.trinitywausau.org for the most up-to-date information. In the rare event that our childcare center should also close, we will note on those platforms. For all other chilly days, please make sure your child has winter clothes so they are able to get fresh air during the winter months.

Facilities/Properties

Voters voted to resurface the north parking lot on Stewart Ave between 4th and 5th Avenues. We are working to get that scheduled for this summer.

January Financial Summary

We are maintaining 100% of the budget for tithes and offerings 6 months into the fiscal year. In addition, this income is up about \$4,300 from last year at the same time. Thank you for your continued support of the staff, programs and services that we provide here.

The financial chart includes 4 line items at the bottom that show the "bottom" line for each area within the church. We added a 5th line this year to reflect the School Choice Reserve Liability. We are all one budget, but we do have individual responsibilities for our respective areas. There is also a comparison to last year in the chart. Highlights from last month's financials include:

Childcare:

- Childcare was roughly breakeven in January, and continues to perform better than budget year-to-date.
- We have on-boarded several staff in January, but we are looking for someone to lead the ECC program.

School:

- School financials look good. We are bringing in less than what we expected on the School Choice, but we knew that going into this year. Expenses are assisting with the balance.
- Tuition will increase in the 2025-26 school year. This should not be a barrier to a Christian education families who are concerned about the increase are encouraged to apply for the Education Grant Fund, which is in place to help offset the cost of tuition.

Church:

• Tithes and Offerings: January income was higher than budget (6%), and we are maintaining to the budget. Year-to-date, tithes and offerings are at 101% of budget! This is a far better position than we were in this time last year (92%). There is about an \$8,000 difference from last year at the same time.

Overall:

- Overall, we are right where we expected to be at this point in the year. That does not always happen, and we are grateful to the congregation for the continued generosity.
- As always, if you have an idea about how we can be practicing better stewardship of the congregation's funds, or if you feel that we are not being good stewards in one area or another, please discuss that with Chad Schwantes, Chairman of the Congregation (chairman@trinitynet.org). We strive to be good stewards of the LORD's gifts.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
- Endowment Loan: \$63,323 ← Perspective...we borrowed \$212,000 from the Endowment in 2018 with the goal of paying it back in 15 years We are WAY ahead of schedule with interest.
- Thrivent Loan: \$451,600 ← Perspective...this was just under \$1,000,000 when I began at Trinity in August 2015!
- TOTAL Debt: \$514,923

Checking: \$61,999Savings: \$985,686Endowment: \$941,078

ENDOWMENT DISTRIBUTION

Annually in January, the Endowment distributes funds to Trinity. This year's distribution was \$37,196, which is allocated to the following:

32% to Church Maintenance & Restoration: \$11,843 7% to Church Worker Scholarships: \$2,581 27% to School Operations: \$10,031

7% to School Scholarships (Education Grant Fund): \$2,581

1% to Organ Maintenance: \$342 6% to Seminary Scholarships: \$2,129 20% to Unrestricted/Savings: \$7,687
