

September is now upon us. That means the end of summer, the return to school and a more regular schedule for most of us. The days are getting shorter. Cooler weather is now settling upon us.

The start of another school year means ramping back up some of our programs here at Trinity Lutheran Church and School. The kids resume Sunday School, Confirmation classes begin, and we have the return of Wednesday evening Bible Study.

This year we're trying something a little different with Confirmation class. The catechumens will be gathering on Sunday morning during Sunday School hour to receive instruction in the Lutheran faith, as found in Luther's Small Catechism.

Our Bible study hour begins its journey through the Revelation of St. John. You can find a blurb about what to expect in the class later in the newsletter.

In regards to school starting back up, I want to take you back to Pastor Smith's article from June. For those of you who read it, you will recall that he offered you a challenge. Openings For New Students

We have spent all summer enhancing Trinity Childcare by hiring and training qualified childcare providers. That investment in training and development gave us the ability to welcome several new students into our center—an opportunity we have not had in quite some time. Our plan now is to bring on more students in waves throughout the fall. There is a wait list for admittance into our infant and toddler classroom that we are addressing by reallocating some space in our building to split this age group into two rooms to accommodate the greatest number of students while still aligning with staff to student licensing ratio guidelines. We are hoping to see this through to completion by November of this year. We are pleased to announce that our 2and 3-year-old classrooms currently have room for growth, and we invite families to call us at 715-848-0166 for more information, for a tour, and to reserve a spot for your 2 - 4-year-old! These spaces are limited, and we expect these high-demand spots to fill up fast!

School-Age Care

We have decided to make a small change with a big impact to our school-age extended childcare program. We are grouping our 5K and 4K/Sonshine room friends together after school as opposed to all students 5K and up being together in one classroom, as it has been historically. This gives us the opportunity to ensure activities are developmentally appropriate for each age group and to keep our staff to student ratio at its most effective. Parents of 5K students will now pick-up their child(ren) from the Sonshine room vs the upstairs ECC classroom.


At the time that I am writing this, we have 176 students enrolled in our 4K-8th grade program. Praise God!

Facilities/Properties

There are not many changes to the Facilities report this month – Miron is nearing completion of brick work. We have been blessed with good weather for brick laying this summer, and our brick team is very grateful for that. They have been quite complimentary of the original brick work at Trinity, and they have worked hard to ensure that the restoration honors the original build.

The restroom partitions are back and in. Please thank Dean and Derek for all of their hard work to get those out and back in before school started! It was quite a physical project. A huge thank you to our community partners at Crystal Finishing for a job well done.

Childcare Update (There are no changes from the previous report in case it was missed last month...our Childcare staff continue to be wonderful through this transition, and we continue to fill the few remaining positions)

Beginning in May 2023, we restructured the Childcare by rewriting position descriptions. Upcoming changes were communicated to existing staff in April, followed by individual meetings with staff members to discuss personal impacts. All staff members were encouraged to apply for the positions posted in May. We were able to retain all existing staff members through this process.

In addition to retaining the 7 existing staff members, we hired additional staff members who started in June. In mid-June, we implemented a training program for all Childcare staff, which consisted of leadership/professionalism classes facilitated by Gina Maroszek, scripturally-based training targeting the 8th Commandment/gossip and Reconciliation provided by Pastor Smith, and training required of licensed childcare centers such as Bloodborne Pathogens, regulatory requirements, and mandated reporter. We will continue training in September with Trinity's Guiding Principles, effective communication, and wayfinding. This training has equipped our staff with essential skills in a childcare environment. We have also focused on bringing all childcare providers up to speed with educational requirements of providers in a licensed childcare center so that we can remain competitive with those centers.

We are ready to bring on new students, and we continue to look for a qualified Childcare Director. The School Board, with the help of the Elders, are looking for a candidate who can be more ministry-focused in this position. These changes have prepared us for a healthier childcare operation moving forward, and we are so excited to see what the future brings.

July Financial Summary

As a personal note: With all of the additional duties I have taken on in Childcare this summer, I am behind in the area of finance. While I know it is undesirable, I simply do not have enough hours in the day to do it all and still be everything God calls me to be outside of this place. Please forgive the lack of financial reporting this month as I catch up in preparation for the School Choice audit September 6th and 7th. There will be a financial report in October's newsletter.

May God continue to work within you to continue to support the ministry at Trinity with time, talents and treasure as we move into Fiscal Year 2024...we are excited about gathering people to grow in faith, and we hope you are, too!
