Students' physical and verbal aggression should be addressed using a multimodal approach. We teach youth basic "anger management," but do they use it, and does it work? Teaching them to recognize their anger is the first step toward anger control. Their self-centeredness prevents them from considering anyone other than themselves. Thinking about others or feeling empathy for a situation can change their perspective, which in turn can change the outcome. Students have problems at school and home, but do they have the skills to solve them? In a social media-induced world, youth may lack the ability to have one-on-one verbal engagement. Social skills enable them to negotiate situations and express their emotions or frustrations. The techniques taught in this workshop will address all these needs and can be adapted to a schedule that's conducive to your school. Elementary, middle, and high school teachers, counselors, and administrative staff can teach workshop concepts in individual or group settings.
